

BRISTOL PARKS AND RECREATION MEETING-MINUTES FEBRUARY 15, 2010

COMMISSIONERS PRESENT: Gordon Benner and Paul Tierney. Commissioner Leemen had a previously sojourn away from Bristol as did Secretary Chandler and therefore they were not in attendance. Commissioner Tierney being the junior member present acted as Secretary.

Gordon called meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

MINUTES: On motion by Gordon, seconded by Paul the minutes from the February 1 meeting were accepted as written.

FUTURE MEETINGS: Election Day is Monday March 15 and the town hall is unavailable for a Commission meeting. The next two meetings will be on Monday March 1 at 6 p.m. and Monday March 22 at 6 p. m. As in the past, the Commission will host a supper at the school just before the annual town meeting.

GROUNDS/MAINTENANCE REPORT: Gordon reported that he and his crew had been cutting and burning brush. Also that the wooden trash holders for the barrels at the various park sites had to be repaired and painted and that the crew would do the tasks as weather permitted. Gordon reported that the tractor was to have hydraulic hoses installed at no cost as these were not on the tractor when delivered.

EMPLOYMENT: Paul reported that he has some employment applications including four from employees who worked last year and one from a college student who spends summers in area. Several other former employees have stated a desire to return this year. The Commission will place ad the latter part of March.

OTHER BUSINESS: Paul requested that Gordon replace the trash receptacle at the Lighthouse Park as the top was blown off in a storm recently. Gordon will take care of it.

LEASE: Gordon reported that the tenant for the concession stand at the beach indicated a desire to renew the lease. The tenant was to come to this meeting to sign the renewal but did not show up.

The next meeting will be held on Monday March 1 at 6:00 p.m. at the Bristol Town Office.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:30.
