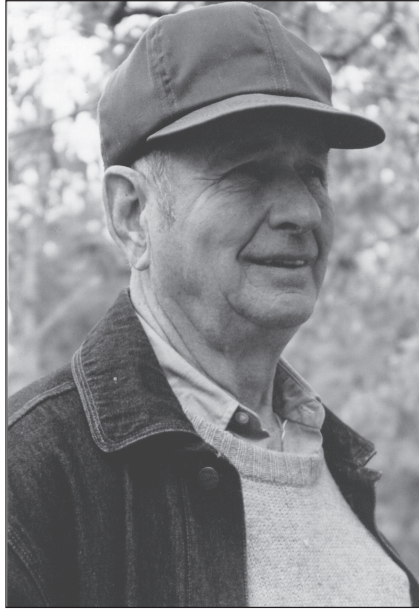

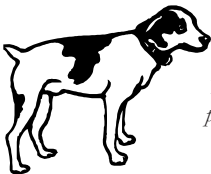

There are two reasons for the licensing of dogs: the control of rabies and identification of the owner when a dog is found at large. Licensing a dog costs only \$6 for altered dogs and \$11 for unaltered and can be done at the Town Office, or online (follow the links from www.maine.gov). A new license can be obtained at any time during the year once the dog has reached 6 months of age. Renewals can be done from October 15 through January 31, after which a \$25.00 late fee is charged. (*Certificates of neutering and rabies vaccination must be presented*). The Town asks that all dog owners comply with State law by licensing their dogs and by controlling the behavior of their dogs at all times, either by voice control or by restraint.

The Collection of Taxes

Assessments are based on the status of properties on April 1st of the tax year. Valuations can be adjusted at any time during April, or until the taxes have been committed to the Collector. Upon commitment the valuations become permanent record and can be changed only through the abatement process. Tax bills will be mailed to the owner of record as of April 1st, and if known to the Town, a copy will be mailed to any new owner. It is interesting to note that in Maine, the tax bill is not a legal requirement.

The due date and the interest rate for late payment are determined by vote of the Townspeople at the March Annual Town Meeting. In 2013, the Selectmen will recommend September 16 for the due date and 7% for the interest rate on late tax payments (7% is the maximum rate allowable in 2013, as set by the State Treasurer). Prepayment of taxes in any amount will be accepted at any time.

The Lien Process

Between eight and twelve months after the tax commitment, the Treasurer will place a lien on all real estate with unpaid taxes. The costs of the lien are paid by the Town and must be paid by the delinquent taxpayer before the lien can be discharged. If the lien remains unpaid for 18 months after being recorded, the Town becomes the owner of the property. At this point the prior owner may negotiate with the Selectmen to buy back the property, or the Town can sell the property at auction.

Homestead Exemption

You are entitled to a Homestead Exemption if:

1. You are a legal resident of Maine as of April 1st, 2013 and have owned a homestead property here for at least the last 12 months;
2. That property has been your permanent residence for the past 12 months;
3. It is the only property for which you are claiming a homestead exemption.

If you are already receiving this exemption, there is no need to reapply. If not, applications are available at the Town Office and must be filed before April 1st.

BRISTOL FIRE & RESCUE

Paul Leeman Jr., Fire Chief

Bristol Fire & Rescue responded to 372 emergency calls during 2012, 11 more than the previous year.

Our mission statement, "Bristol Fire & Rescue will provide the highest level of service to protect life, property, and the environment" is a pledge taken by all members to the residents of the Town of Bristol and our mutual aid towns. Members have spent a total of 1536.5 hours in training to enhance their skills. I would like to thank Training Officer Neal Kimball, who spent countless hours preparing the evening and weekend exercises. Parking improvements were made to our training facility at the Transfer Station property which provides a safe place to train away from the flow of traffic.

We have completed our compliance to communications upgrades which needed to be in place by January 2013, and to our drivers training policy changes, which needed to be in place by March 1, 2012. We will continue installing dry hydrants throughout the town in order to make water more accessible. This year we installed a dry hydrant at the bridge by Hammond Lumber, and we are negotiating with land owners for the addition of two more sites.

Two committees have been busy gathering information on replacing Rescue 1 and Tank 3. Rescue 1, our EMS vehicle, will be purchased entirely with donation monies. We have until June 2013 to replace Tank 3, as it will not pass another inspection. We plan to purchase a new tanker with a 500 GPM pump.

This will replace the Round Pond tanker (taken out of service in 2011); Bristol Tank 3; and the aging 1985 Engine 1. We are asking the town for help in purchasing this apparatus with some monies coming from a Samoset Fire Co. trust fund disbursement and the town's truck reserve account.

Upgrades to Station 1 (New Harbor) are underway with the help of prison trustees and Deputy Grover from the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office. Station 2 had the metal roof project completed and Station 3 will have the meeting room floor redone this year.

After many years of service to Bristol Fire & Rescue three members have recently retired. A huge thank you goes out to Assistant Chief Gil Jaeger (36 years of service); Captain Robert Ball (34 years of service); and Trustee and firefighter Don Meakin (32 years of service). I also want to recognize two members who have stayed on after many years of service and continue to play very important roles: Jack Brackett (62 years of service) and Ron Pendleton (58 years of service) continue to give their all to Bristol Fire & Rescue. Their combined 120 years of knowledge and experience is vital to mentoring all of our members. I would like to say "Job well done" to these ageless members! Like many departments throughout the country new members are constantly needed. With that in mind, I gratefully acknowledge that we were fortunate to have 4 new members join in 2012.

As in years past, we participated in the Easter egg hunt; the Round Pond 4th of July parade; Olde Bristol Days; the Alvin Sproul Samoset Road Race;

fire education training with the Bristol School; the Bristol Mills Fall Festival; and Santa's arrival by helicopter at the Pemaquid Lighthouse Park. The department and many of these projects are supported by the Bristol Fire & Rescue Ladies Auxiliary. This fine group of people continues to offer their support and fundraising efforts to benefit our department.

There is still a need to remind everyone to post your house number in a very visible location so it can be seen coming from all directions from the road. Mail boxes especially need to be numbered on both sides so responders coming from any direction can identify the residence. Private driveways and roads still need to have trees and branches cut 12 feet high and 15 feet wide to allow the safe passage of a fire engine or ambulance. Winter travel conditions pose difficult conditions to responders. Driveways need to be sanded and plowed to a width that allows large emergency apparatus to access your residence and property. Batteries in all smoke alarms and CO detectors should be changed when you change your clocks in the spring and fall.

It is an honor for all members of Bristol Fire & Rescue to serve the residents of the Town of Bristol. I want to thank all of the members for their many hours of dedicated service, and their families whose support them, as well as the employers who allow members to respond during working shifts. Remember that we are available every moment of every day throughout the year.

As I begin my fourth year as Fire Chief I want to thank all residents for the privilege of serving in this capacity and I will

continue to do my very best. I want to thank all who continue to support this fine organization through their generous donations. I want everyone to be proud of their Bristol Fire & Rescue. ♦

PEMAQUID WATERSHED ASSOCIATION

Pemaquid Watershed Association (PWA) began in 1966 as the Biscay Pond Association. PWA is a member-supported non-profit organization with a mission to conserve the natural resources of the Pemaquid Peninsula through land and water stewardship and education, focusing on the 47 square miles of Pemaquid River watershed. PWA's membership continues to increase and reached 964 in 2012. Over half (54.2% or 19.6 sq. miles) of Bristol is in the Pemaquid River watershed, including Boyd Pond and part of Biscay Pond.

Highlights of PWA's 2012 programming include:

- 3rd season of water quality monitoring at Biscay Beach and Bristol Mills Swimming Hole.
- 10th year of water quality monitoring at Pemaquid Beach.
- Providing public access to trails, open space, and shorefront in Bristol via maintenance of six nature preserves in Bristol, attracting tourists to the area and benefitting local residents.
- 8th year of maintaining the Bristol Recreational Trail for the Town.
- 9th year of staffing and programming at Beachcombers' Rest Nature Center at Pemaquid Beach Park. In 2012, over 2,000 people visited the nature cen-

ter, attended a workshop, and/or experienced the weekly touch tank.

- 8th year of the Courtesy Boat Inspection program to educate boaters and minimize the risk of undesirable plants invading the Pemaquid-area ponds.
- 4th year of coordinating the LakeSmart program for Biscay Pond and Pemaquid Pond shoreline residents, providing free technical assistance to help landowners protect pondwater quality.

PWA exemplifies a grassroots movement powered collectively by volunteers, community members, businesses, other agencies, and our local municipalities. PWA looks forward to continuing to serve the citizens of Bristol and helping to protect this beautiful area. We thank the Town of Bristol for its ongoing support of PWA. ♦

FISHERMEN'S MUSEUM

The Museum quietly celebrated its 40th season at Pemaquid Point Lighthouse Park with a record attendance of 37,763 visitors when compared to the previous ten years and hopefully an indicator that more vacationers will be enjoying the coast of Maine in future years.

A second record set this season is the total amount of donations that the Fishermen's Museum has received and given to the Town of Bristol during these 40 seasons. Our 2012 contribution of \$2,317.00 raises the total funds donated directly to the Town over our 40 year history to \$252,248.00. The do-

nations we receive go directly to artifact restoration, exhibit maintenance and a small operating budget, with the balance donated to the Town of Bristol.

Admission is free and the museum is open during normal Lighthouse Park hours.

Our collection of local fishing heritage includes original tools, traps, nets, artifacts, displays, dioramas, ship logs and first person accounts of shipwrecks, along with rare and unusual items that presents the history of the Bristol community to visitors from home and away. We have also placed a number of photographs and other museum artifacts in the Learning Center. The Fishermen's Museum and Learning Center at Lighthouse Park provide warm and inviting destinations for our friends and visitors all season long.

We are fortunate to have enjoyed the support of a dedicated group of volunteers over the past 40 years. It is through their efforts and the enthusiastic support of the Bristol Park Commissioners that the Fishermen's Museum has been so successful. Thanks to all who contribute their time and continue to insure that our museum remains an important educational destination for visitors and maritime scholars. ♦

BRISTOL AREA LIBRARY

In 2012 we celebrated 50 great years, starting with a kick-off on the anniversary date of April 11th with a reception to recognize student artists from the Bristol Consolidated School.

Viewing our monthly art displays is just one of the many reasons people come to the library, and this past year we welcomed 9,772 adults and 985 children.

Keeping current with technology is one of the goals of the library and computer use is an important service to our patrons, as is our wireless capability. Our 2,740 video and audio items were signed out 4,278 times, and we are enrolled in the Maine State Library downloadable books program with 478 books downloaded to patrons' computers or other devices. It is worth mentioning 10,929 of our 25,000 print items circulated and that this number holds strong to the past year and previous years.

PEMAQUID GROUP OF ARTISTS

Celebrating 84 years of continuous exhibition, members of the Pemaquid Group of Artists (PGA) have shown their original artwork for the last 52 years on the grounds of beautifully maintained Lighthouse Park. The Pemaquid Art Gallery building was constructed in 1960 jointly by PGA and the Town. One of the oldest artist organiza-

tions in Maine, PGA juries new members from artists residing in area towns of Bristol, South Bristol, Bremen, Newcastle, and Damariscotta. Each exhibiting artist pays a seasonal fee to the Town of Bristol, which owns the gallery building.

Each year, a richly diverse exhibit of artwork – including oil, pastel, watercolor, and acrylic paintings, as well as ceramics and marquetry – fills the gallery. Fresh work is continually hung as others are sold. In 2012, the exhibition featured the art of 26 permanent members and two seasonal guest artists. Despite the continued unsettled economic situation, our sales in 2012 were stronger than in the prior season. Gallery admission is free for park visitors, but donations are gratefully accepted.

After a gala public reception on June 10, the gallery welcomed visitors daily through Columbus Day. PGA is a Maine non-profit organization that provides a venue for qualified artists to exhibit and sell their artwork. PGA also strives to enrich the arts culture for area residents, children, and visitors. Our special events in 2012 included a reception for gallery patrons in August and outdoor artist demonstrations on Open Lighthouse Day in September.

As always, we are grateful to our patron members, whose loyal enthusiasm mirrors that of our artist members, Board of Directors, and knowledgeable gallery attendants, all of whom are artists themselves. In 2012 Nancy O'Brien MacKinnon, an artist member of PGA, became our Gallery Manager. We are delighted she will fill this role again in 2013.

PGA supports arts education through financial donations to three area elementary schools and the preschool program Healthy Kids. As we have for many years, we funded a pass to the Portland Museum of Art. This free pass is available to Bristol and other Maine residents by reservation through Skidompha Library in Damariscotta.

Through donation of sales proceeds from several artworks by our members in 2012, we continue to build a Scholarship Fund to help a deserving Lincoln Academy graduate pursue an arts education. The first award was made in 2012 to Hannah Boone.

We enjoy seeing the many summer residents and visitors who return regularly to view the new artwork. Our website, www.pemaquidartgallery.com, provides information about our artists, events and charitable activities.

Our very active Board has nine members. In fall 2012, we said goodbye to Director Kay Hannah, our hard working past president, and welcomed Paul Sherman aboard as new director. ♦

OLD BRISTOL HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The Old Bristol Historical Society is a charitable and educational non-profit corporation serving the public. Its purpose is to collect, preserve, and share the artifacts and the oral, documentary and physical histories of the communities formerly comprising the Old Township of Bristol. Our goal is to keep these histories alive by collecting relevant artifacts, researching and

interpreting these documents, recording memories of its citizens, and by exploring and photographing the buildings and other historical landmarks before they are lost. Our aim is to foster a sense of pride and community in our collective past and have local people and institutions become involved.

Formed as recently as 2003, by the standards of comparable organizations in surrounding towns, we are a young organization serving an area with a rich history from long before the first permanent settlements in the early 1700s to the present.

Programs and meetings are held June-September in our 1856 one-room McKinley School on Harrington Road in Pemaquid Falls. Monthly open houses were held there from 2-4 p.m. on Sunday afternoons. At our August open house we had a showing of early American artifacts from the region. In August 2013, an old photo and postcard viewing session will be held. Our varied Sunday evening programs, open to the public, drew regular enthusiasts as well as area visitors.

Map work on a major project, Historical Resource Surveys for Round Pond and Bristol Mills, is being completed by Kenneth Coombs and Rose Marie Ballard.

The current board of 14 directors and officers continues to look for meaningful ways to help interest and inspire our townspeople, and particularly our young people, in Old Bristol's fascinating historical past.

An Antiques and Curios Sale fundraiser and member dues have

helped toward operating costs for such necessities as electricity, insurance, newsletter mailings, and upkeep and repairs. Our Building Committee and Directors mull challenges ahead in maintaining an old building, and deciding whether to undertake some major renovations to mend inadequacies related to exterior painting, insulation, access, water supply, plumbing and heating. With the board's experience and revitalizing vision we strive to move forward in ways that will meet our goals.

At this time we seek replacements for several officers and board members who have had to leave or will be retiring in July 2013. We appreciate those who support us with donations of time and energy, attendance at programs and events, and ideas for our future. ♦

LINCOLN COUNTY TELEVISION

Lincoln County Television (LCTV), established in 1991, is a non-profit organization that manages Public Access Channel 7 on Time Warner Cable for 10 towns in Lincoln County: Alna, Bristol, Damariscotta, Dresden, Edgecomb, Newcastle, Nobleboro, Waldoboro, Westport Island, and Wiscasset. The channel currently reaches approximately 11,200 individuals in our community and our locally produced programs are available to untold numbers worldwide via the internet at www.lctv.org.

2012 highlights:

- We are very proud to report that the

Town of Newcastle honored LCTV and volunteer Christopher Dougherty, who taped all the Newcastle Select Board meetings, with a 2012 Spirit of America Award for Volunteerism. LCTV volunteer, Alex Diamond, was also honored with a Volunteer Appreciation Award by the Town of Wiscasset. Alex has been taping Wiscasset Select Board meetings since 2010.

With funds from a PEG grant obtained by Wiscasset, and proceeds from our 2011 auction, we were able to purchase much needed equipment including:

- A Slingbox for relaying video/audio signal via the internet to the station for live broadcasts; 2 Canon XL2 camcorders;
- An Eartec COMSTAR XT-5 Full Duplex Wireless Intercom System for studio and field productions;
- Upgrades to the editing bays, including new desks and chairs, the latest Premier Pro software, and extra internal hard drives;
- Interior storm windows were made and installed resulting in a warmer work space and decreased energy costs;
- The studio was upgraded with curtains donated by our friends at the Lincoln Theater and a moveable green floor for chroma-key studio productions;
- In memory of Stephen Hanna of Damariscotta who lost his life in March of 2012, we received a gift of \$1500 to purchase a downstream keyer which allows us to place crawls and titles over broadcast videos;
- Station access hours were expanded to 26.5 a week (was 22.5);
- Teamed with Pumpkin Fest and Lincoln Theater for the 2nd year in a row to produce live coverage of the Pumpkin Fest Regatta and the Underwater Pumpkin Carving. New this year was a multi-camera shoot and live broadcast of events on LCTV Cable Channel 7;
- Installation of recording equipment in the Bristol Town Office and the Newcastle Town Office for “one button” recordings of government meetings;
- Gave instruction to 14 students, one of whom, Haven Simmons of Great Salt Bay, went on to produce an anti-bullying video which placed in the top 25 of more than 900 nationwide entries;
- 657 shows containing new content were locally produced in 2012, 364 of which are available for viewing on LCTV’s website, www.lctv.org Video on Demand (VOD).

LCTV has come a long way in the last few years and we have plans to go even further. 2013 projects include working with local historical organizations to produce Ken Burns type documentaries; offering a kid’s summer video camp; and producing instructional videos with teachers in at GSB. We are always looking for volunteers, so please consider putting your talents and experience to good use by helping LCTV be the best community television station it can possibly be! ♦

BRISTOL PARKS & RECREATION

The Bristol Parks and Recreation Commission oversees 10 properties. These include: Pemaquid Point Lighthouse Park, Pemaquid Beach Park, the Swimming Hole at Bristol Mills, Hanna Landing, Town Landing, Old Rock School House, Moxie Cove picnic area, Pemaquid Falls picnic area, Pemaquid River canoe-kayak launch, Ellingwood Park and Visitors Center.

Our first year at Ellingwood Park Visitors Center was successful utilizing a staff of volunteers. Several Bristol artists exhibited and sold their work at this location. Plans include a leach field and a bathroom to be installed this year.

Lighthouse Park drew upwards of 100,000 visitors in 2012. Weddings have become increasingly popular, and are held every weekend throughout the season, with some weekends having many back to back ceremonies. The Learning Center at Lighthouse Park hosted a popular series of speakers and weekly free movie nights which we will continue in 2013.

Pemaquid Beach had a spectacular season. We had several new faces on our staff along with our long-time employees from Florida, Jefferson, Damariscotta and the Bristol area. This past year we painted the beach building, put a new roof on the work garage at the beach, and added beach towels with *Pemaquid Beach* embroidered on them, which are available for sale at the Beach Shop and Ellingwood Park. Plans include an improved ticket booth, additional picnic tables and umbrellas, and improved drainage in the showers. Within the next year or two, the septic at the beach will require pumping, at a significant cost. The Pemaquid Watershed Association continued to provide a vital presence at Beachcombers' Rest Nature Center which included a touch tank on Wednesdays that was a delight to young and old. PWA also provided guest speakers on various topics, including sharks. Another popular activity last year, and hopefully this coming season, was Yoga at the Beach held Tuesday and Thursday mornings.

Additional plans include: continuing our sell out BBQ chicken dinners and concerts, where parks employees and commissioners volunteer their time to prepare, serve and clean up. We will continue to participate in National Lighthouse Day on September 14th, PWA Coastal Cleanup in September, and Flying Santa in December with Bristol Fire Department.

Thank you-thank you-thank you to all of the Bristol Parks employees and volunteers who make this all so much fun. To the Bristol Selectmen and town employees who keep us steady as we go. To the year-round residents and summer folks who support our efforts. And to the thousands of visitors who come to our beautiful coast to appreciate what we all have daily.

Parks Commission meetings are the first and third Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at the Bristol Town Hall. Please join us with thoughts, ideas, suggestions and questions for the Parks Department. ♦

Bristol PreK - Grade 12 Education Report: PreK – Grade 12 – 303 students

Bristol Consolidated School: PreK - Grade 8: The 2012-2013 school year has been a positive and productive year thus far. We are enjoying the presence of a new group of 16 eager children in our Pre-K (Public Four-Year Old Program). These young learners are fully participating in the school and have been a very welcome addition. The primary classrooms are benefitting from some new technology with the addition of iPads to the K- 2 classrooms. We continue to explore ways to stay “caught up” with the technology in our ever-changing world while balancing the learning needs of our students. 5-8 classrooms are utilizing different web-based resources to enhance their learning. Enrollment for our PreK-8 program includes 192 students. *From David A. Kolodin, Chair:* On behalf of the Bristol School Committee, we wish to thank the voting citizens of the town of Bristol for their support of the new 4-year old program, aka Pre-Kindergarten, which came into existence in September 2012. Our model is being studied by other districts and we look forward with anticipation to the next class starting in September 2013.

We continue to focus on civility and safety. The teachers have been trained in Restorative School Practices to encourage a more supportive classroom and school culture. Classrooms regularly conduct “community circles” to develop a sense of belonging and understanding. Our crisis plans continue to be reviewed. Safety drills are regularly conducted.

At Bristol School meeting the needs of all students is our top priority. Staff meet in Professional Learning Communities to discuss student progress and to plan appropriate instruction to meet individual needs. Interventions are implemented to support academic growth specifically targeted in reading and math. Behavioral support and reinforcement of appropriate choices is a focus to support the social and emotional development of our students. Enrichment options are scheduled for students who are meeting and exceeding the targets.

Bristol Consolidated School continues to make growth on our state assessment, the NECAPs. We were chosen by the University of Southern Maine to participate in its study of improving public PK-12 schools in Maine. We are pleased with the progress we are making and recognize the need for continued growth in the future. We take great pride in the efforts we have made and those yet to come.

Grades 9 -12: Bristol has 111 students in grades 9-12, with 98 attending Lincoln Academy. Five students attend other private schools and eight students attend various school opportunities. These students continue to achieve to high levels. Lincoln Academy continues a very high placement level of students seeking post-secondary learning. Additionally, 0 of 38 students from Lincoln Academy

entering Maine colleges/universities/Community College system needed any remedial courses. The School Boards of the Central Lincoln County School System meet with the Board of Directors of Lincoln Academy a couple times per year in order to align curriculum and prepare for transition of our grade eight students to a successful experience in high school.

Thank you for your continued support for our PreK - grade 12 learners. It is greatly appreciated. ♦

We have audited the accompanying general purpose financial statements of the Town of Bristol, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2012 and 2011, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the Table of Contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Town of Bristol's management. Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit.

An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinions.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the Town of Bristol as of December 31, 2012 and 2011, and the respective changes in financial position and cash flows, for the years then ended in conformity with accounting

principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis and budgetary comparison information on Schedule A-1 be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town of Bristol's finan-

cial statements as a whole. The introductory section, combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements, and statistical section are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements. The combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements are the responsibility of management and were derived from and relate directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such infor-

mation directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the information is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the financial statements as a whole. The introductory and statistical sections have not been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, accordingly, we do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on them. *January 27, 2013*



MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION & ANALYSIS

Fiscal Year Ended December 31, 2012

The Municipal Officers of the Town of Bristol, Maine offer the readers of Bristol's financial statements this narrative overview and analysis of its financial activities for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2012. We encourage readers to consider the information presented in conjunction with additional information furnished in the basic financial statements and the accompanying notes to those financial statements.

The Financial Statements

The financial statements presented herein include all activities of the Town of Bristol, Maine using the integrated approach as prescribed by GASB (Gov-

ernmental Accounting Standards Board) Statement No. 34. The government-wide financial statements present the financial picture of the Town using the accrual basis of accounting. They present governmental activities (functions that are principally supported by taxes and intergovernmental revenues) and business-type activities (functions that are intended to recover all or a significant portion of their costs through user fees and charges) separately. These statements include all assets of the Town as well as all liabilities, including long-term debt.

The fund financial statements include statements for each of the three categories of activity: governmental,

business-type and fiduciary. Notes to the financial statements provide additional information that is essential to a full understanding of the data provided in the government-wide and fund financial statements.

Statement of Net Assets and Statement of Activities

The statement of net assets and statement of activities report information about the Town and its activities as a whole. Excluding infrastructure, these statements include all assets and liabilities of the Town using the accrual basis of accounting, which is similar to the accounting used by most private-sector companies. All of the current year's revenues and expenses are taken into account regardless of when cash is received or paid.

These two statements report the Town's net assets and changes in them. Net assets are the difference between assets and liabilities, which is one way to measure the Town's financial health or financial position. Over time, increases and decreases in net assets are one indicator of whether the Town's financial health is improving or deteriorating. Other factors to consider are changes in the Town's property tax base and the condition of its infrastructure. In the statement of net assets and statement of activities, the Town's activities are separated as follows:

Governmental activities: Most of the Town's basic services are reported in this category, including public safety, public works, and general administrative services. Property taxes, excise taxes, user fees, interest income, cable television

franchise fees and State and Federal grants finance these activities.

Business-type activities: Parks and Recreation is considered a "business-type" activity. A fee is charged to customers to cover costs associated with admission to and use of Bristol's parks. Parks and Recreation is completely self-supporting through admissions, rental income and other user fees.

Fund Financial Statements

The fund financial statements provide detailed information about the most significant funds, not the Town as a whole. A fund is a grouping of related accounts used to maintain control over resources that have been segregated for specific activities or objectives. Some funds are required to be established by State law or by grantor. In the Town of Bristol, these include worthy poor funds, cemetery funds and a small fund set aside for maintenance of the Rock Schoolhouse. Management, however, establishes other funds to help it control and manage money for particular purposes. During fiscal year 2012 Bristol had eight "capital reserve" accounts: the Highway Equipment Fund, the Fire Truck Fund, the Revaluation Fund, the Building Fund, the Computer Fund, the Parks Fund, the School Boiler Fund and the Learning Center Fund.

Governmental Funds

Most of the Town's basic services are reported in governmental funds, which focus on how money flows into and out of those funds and the remaining balances at year end that are available

for spending. These funds are reported using an accounting method called “modified accrual,” which measures cash and all other financial assets that can be readily converted to cash. The governmental fund statements provide a detailed, shorter-term view of the Town’s general government operations and the basic services it provides. Governmental fund information helps determine whether there are more or fewer financial resources that can be spent in the near future to finance the Town’s programs. The Town’s governmental funds consist of the following:

General Fund: The general operating fund of the Town used to account for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund.

Proprietary Funds: When the Town charges customers for services it provides (business-type activities), these services are generally reported in proprietary funds. Proprietary funds are reported in the same way that all activities are reported in the Statement of Net Assets and Statement of Activities.

Fiduciary Funds: The Town’s fiduciary funds are held in trust for the benefit of others. These funds are not included in the government-wide financial statements and cannot be used to support general government activities and operations.

Governmental Activities

The cost of all governmental activities in 2012 was \$7,234,527.29, an increase of \$312,899.50 in comparison to 2011. Some of the costs were paid by those who directly benefited from the programs, or by other governments and organizations that subsidized certain programs with operating grants and contributions. The Town paid for the “public benefit” portion of governmental activities with property taxes and through additional sources such as excise tax, interest, State revenue sharing, cable television franchise fees and other miscellaneous revenues.

Town programs include education, general government, health and welfare, highways and bridges, protection, special assessments (County tax), and unclassified. Each program’s net cost (total cost less revenues generated by the activities) is presented below. The net costs show the financial burden placed on the Town’s taxpayers by each of the functions

On December 31, 2012, Bristol’s net assets for governmental activities totaled \$8,336,131.76. Net assets as of December 31, 2011 were \$8,352,388.92 and

\$7,945,823.37 as of December 31, 2010. The result is a decrease in net assets of \$16,257.16 during fiscal year 2012.

Business-Type Activities

The cost of the Town's only proprietary fund, Bristol Parks and Recreation, was \$300,260.17. The amount paid by users of the system and raised through donations was \$318,047.73, resulting in a net gain of \$17,787.56.

Budgets and Budgetary Accounting

The breakdown of actual expenditures for the year may be found in the Selectmen's Financial Report which is part of the 2012 Annual Report of the Town of Bristol. This could be compared with the proposed budget for 2013 to ascertain potential increases or decreases in individual budgetary items.

Administrative Notes

Bristol had three outstanding loans at the end of fiscal year 2012: School Renovations which matures in 2018, the Partridge Bridge which matures in 2017 and a Fire Truck loan which matures in 2018. The following is a comparison of total long-term debt:

The mill rate decreased from 8.15 per \$1,000.00 of valuation for fiscal year 2010 and 7.85 per \$1,000.00 of valuation for fiscal year 2011 to 7.60 per \$1,000.00 of valuation for fiscal year 2012.

Education accounted for approximately 61% of the tax commitment followed by the County tax assessment at 21% and the Municipal budget at 18%.

Bristol's financial position continues to be exemplary. The Municipal Officers continue to pursue ways to lower the cost of providing essential services to Bristol's taxpayers while preparing for demands on infrastructure, increasing cost of education, the County tax commitment, decreased State revenues, and State and Federal mandates. *

Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2012

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

The accounting policies of the Town of Bristol conform to generally accepted accounting principles as applicable to governmental units.

1. Financial Reporting Entity

The Town of Bristol was incorporated in 1765. The Town operates under a town meeting form of government.

In evaluating the Town of Bristol as a reporting entity, management has addressed all potential component units. The primary criteria for including a component reporting entity are the exercise of financial accountability by the Town of Bristol's municipal officials.

The Town's financial statements are prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) is responsible for establishing Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) for state and local governments through its pronouncements (Statements and Interpretations). Governments are also

required to follow the pronouncements of the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued through November 30, 1989 (when applicable) that do not conflict with or contradict GASB pronouncements. The more significant accounting policies established in GAAP are used by the Town as discussed below.

In June 1999, the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) unanimously approved Statement No. 34, *Basic Financial Statements—and Management's Discussion and Analysis—for State and Local Governments*. Certain significant changes in the Statement include the following:

1.) Financial statements now include:

- A Management's Discussion and Analysis (MD&A) section providing an analysis of the Town's overall financial position and results of operations.
- Financial statements prepared using full accrual accounting for all of the Town's activities, including infrastructure (roads, bridges, etc.).

2.) A change in the fund financial statements to focus on the major funds.

These and other changes are reflected in the accompanying financial statements (including notes to financial statements). The Town has elected to implement the provisions of the Statement in the year ended June 30, 2004.

In accordance with GASB Statement No. 54, the Town employs terminology and classifications for fund balance items as follows:

Committed fund balances are amounts that can be used only for specific purposes because of a formal action taken by the Town.

Unassigned fund balance are all amounts in the General Fund that are not assigned to another category. Only the General Fund can have an unassigned fund balance.

2. Basic Financial Statements - Government-Wide Statements

The Town's basic financial statements include both government-wide (reporting the Town as a whole) and fund financial statements (reporting the Town's major funds). Both the government-wide and fund financial statements categorize primary activities as governmental. The Town's fire protection, recreation, public works, and general administrative services are classified as governmental activities.

In the government-wide Statements of Net Position, the governmental column is presented on a consolidated basis by column, and is reported on a full accrual, economic resource basis, which recognizes all long-term assets and receivables as well as long-term debt and obligations. The Town's net position is reported in three parts - invested in capital assets, assigned for other purposes, and unassigned. The Town first utilizes restricted resources to finance qualifying activities.

The government-wide Statement of Activities reports both the gross and net cost of each of the Town's functions and business-type activities (fire, public works, administrative, etc.). The functions are also supported by general govern-

ment revenues (property, certain intergovernmental revenues, fines, permits and charges, etc.). The Statement of Activities reduces gross expenses (including depreciation) by related program revenues, operating and capital grants. Program revenues must be directly associated with the function (fire, public works, etc.). Operating grants include operating-specific and discretionary (either operating or capital) grants while the capital grants column reflects capital-specific grants.

The net costs (by function or business-type activity) are normally covered by general revenue (property, intergovernmental revenues, interest income, etc.).

This government-wide focus is more on the sustainability of the Town as an entity and the change in the Town's net assets resulting from the current year's activities.

3. Basic Financial Statements - Fund Financial Statements

The financial transactions of the Town are reported in individual funds in the fund financial statements. Each fund is accounted for by providing a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, reserves, fund equity, revenues and expenditures/expenses. The various funds are reported by generic classification within the financial statements.

The following fund types are used by the Town:

a. Governmental Funds:

The focus of the governmental funds' measurement (in the fund statements) is upon determination of financial position and changes in financial position (sources, uses, and balances of financial resources) rather than upon net income. The following is a description of the governmental funds of the Town:

1. *General Fund*: General Fund is the general operating fund of the Town. It is used to account for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund.
2. *Fiduciary Funds*: Fiduciary Funds are used to report assets held in a trustee or agency capacity for others and therefore are not available to support Town programs. The reporting focus is on net assets and changes in net assets and is reported using accounting principles similar to proprietary funds.

The emphasis in fund financial statements is on the major funds in either the governmental or business-type activities categories. Nonmajor funds by category are summarized into a single column. GASB No. 34 sets forth minimum criteria (percentage of the assets, liabilities, revenues or expenditures/expenses of either fund category) for the determination of major funds.

The Town's fiduciary funds are presented in the fiduciary fund financial statements. Since by definition these assets are being held for the benefit of a third party and cannot be used to address activities or obligations of the government, these funds are not incorporated into the government-wide statements.

3. *Proprietary Fund*: The Proprietary Fund is the fund used to account for all financial resources relating to the Parks and Recreation Department. The generally accepted accounting principles applicable are those similar to business in the private sector.

4. Basis of Accounting

Basis of accounting refers to the point at which revenues or expenditures/expenses are recognized in the accounts and reported in the financial statements. It relates to the timing of the measurements made regardless of the measurement focus applied:

- a. **Accrual**

Governmental activities in the government-wide financial statements and fiduciary fund financial statements are presented on the accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recognized when incurred.

- b. **Modified Accrual**

The governmental funds financial statements are presented on the modified accrual basis of accounting. Under the modified accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recorded when susceptible to accrual; i.e. both measurable and available. "Available" means collectible within the current period or within 60 days after year end. Expenditures are generally recognized under the modified accrual basis of accounting when the related liability is incurred. The exception to this general rule is that principal and interest on general obligation long-term debt, if any, is recognized when due.

5. Financial Statement Amounts

- a. **Cash and Cash Equivalents:**

The Town has defined cash and cash equivalents to include cash on hand, demand deposits, and cash with fiscal agents. Statutes authorize the Treasurer of the Town, as directed by the municipal officers, to invest all municipal funds, including reserve and trust funds, to the extent that the terms of the instrument, order, or article creating the fund do not prohibit the investment in financial institutions as described in Section 5706 MRSA and securities as described in Sections 5711 through 5717 MRSA.

b. Capital Assets:

Capital assets purchased or acquired with an original cost of \$2,000.00 or more are reported at historical cost or estimated historical cost. Contributed assets are reported at fair market value as of the date received. Additions, improvements and other capital outlays that significantly extend the useful life of an asset are capitalized. Other costs incurred for repairs and maintenance are expensed as incurred. Depreciation on all assets is provided on the straight-line basis over the following estimated useful lives:

Buildings	20-50 Years
Machinery and Equipment	5-10 Years
Improvements	10-20 Years
Other Infrastructure	10-50 Years

c. Revenues:

Substantially, all governmental fund revenues are accrued. Property taxes are billed and collected within the same period in which the taxes are levied. In applying GASB No. 33 to grant revenues, the provider recognizes liabilities and expenses and the recipient recognizes receivables and revenue when the applicable eligibility requirements, including time requirements, are met. Resources transmitted before the eligibility requirements are met are reported as advances by the provider and deferred revenue by the recipient.

d. Expenditures:

Expenditures are recognized when the related fund liability is incurred.

e. Use of Estimates:

The presentation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

6. Total Columns

Total columns on the combined statements are captioned "Memorandum Only" to indicate that they are presented to facilitate financial analysis. Data in these columns do not present financial position, results of operations, or changes in financial position in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. Neither is such data comparable to a consolidation. Interfund eliminations have not been made in the aggregation of this data.

NOTE B - CASH:

Cash

The Town’s cash is categorized to give an indication of the level of risk assumed by the Town at year end. These Categories are defined as follows:

- Category 1: Insured or collateralized with securities held by the Town or by its agent in the Town’s name.
- Category 2: Collateralized with securities held by the pledging financial institution’s trust department or agent in the Town’s name.
- Category 3: Uncollateralized (This includes any bank balance that is collateralized with securities held by the pledging financial institution, or by its trust department or agent but not in the Town’s name.)

NOTE E - GENERAL FUND BUDGET:

The town operates on a net budget as compared with a gross budget. All revenues are not estimated, but are credited to the particular operating account. Certain revenues are dedicated for particular purposes by vote of the townspeople at the annual town meeting or at special town meetings.

At the annual town meeting, held in March of each year, the townspeople vote on various articles on which amounts for appropriations have been recommended by the Board of Selectmen and/or the budget committee.

NOTE F - DESIGNATED FOR SUBSEQUENT YEARS' EXPENDITURES:

Historically, the townspeople vote to carry certain departmental unexpended balances forward to the following year for expenditure. This is usually in lieu of additional appropriations in any particular account.

NOTE G - REVENUE RECOGNITION - PROPERTY TAXES:

The town's property tax for the current year was levied June 6, 2012 on the assessed value listed as of April 1, 2012 for all taxable real and personal property located in the Town. Taxes were due September 17, 2012 with interest at 7% per annum or part thereof commencing September 18, 2012.

Tax liens are filed against delinquent real estate taxpayers after eight months but within one year of the original tax commitment. If the tax, interest, and costs have not been paid eighteen months after the filing of a lien certificate then the lien is automatically foreclosed.

The National Council on Governmental Accounting (N.C.G.A.) Interpretation No. 3 requires that property tax revenue be recognized only to the extent it will be collected within sixty days following the year end. The deferred tax revenue shown on the balance sheet represents property taxes not expected to be collected within sixty days after the year end.

Property taxes are recognized when they become available. Available includes those taxes expected to be collected within sixty days after year end as stated above.

NOTE H - RETIREMENT PLAN:

Public school teachers contribute to the Maine State Retirement System ("System"), an agent multiple-employer public employee retirement system that acts as a common investment and administrative agent for public school teachers, state employees (except as members of the judiciary and legislature who are covered under the Judicial and Legislative Retirement Systems) and political subdivisions. All public school teachers participate in the Maine State Retirement System and, if vested with ten years of service prior to July 1993, are eligible for normal retirement upon attaining the age of sixty and after completing twenty-five or more years of creditable service. Vested participants are entitled to a retirement benefit equal to a fraction of the average final compensation multiplied by the years of membership service (discounted for early retirement). The System also provides death, disability, and health insurance benefits. These benefit provisions and all other requirements are established by state statute.

Teachers are required to contribute a portion of their annual salary to the System. The State of Maine contributes the remaining amounts necessary to fund the System, using the actuarial basis specified by statute. The covered payroll for teachers is approximately \$1,295,000.00. As required by Accounting Standards, the amounts paid on behalf of the School Department by the State of Maine has been recorded as an intergovernmental revenue and an expenditure which amounted to \$185,448.00. Information concerning pension benefit obligation for public teachers is available from the Maine Public Employees Retirement System.

NOTE K - RISK MANAGEMENT:

The town is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts; theft of, damage to, and destruction of assets; errors and omissions; injuries to employees; and natural disasters. All significant losses are covered by commercial insurance. There has been no significant reduction in insurance coverage. Settlement amounts have not exceeded insurance coverage for the current year or the three prior years.

NOTE L - INTEREST COST INCURRED:

During the current year the town incurred interest costs totaling \$26,623.48 which was charged as an expense to various accounts.

NOTE M - OVERLAPPING DEBT:

The Town of Bristol is situated in Lincoln County and is therefore subject to annual assessment of its proportional share of county expenses. Long-term debt outstanding in Lincoln County for which the Town of Bristol would be propor-

tionally responsible in the event the county defaulted, is approximately \$8,395,000.00 at December 31, 2012. The Town of Bristol's share would be 15.21% of the debt, or \$1,276,928.55.

NOTE N - EXPENDITURES IN EXCESS OF APPROPRIATIONS:

During the year no expenditures exceeded appropriations in any general fund categories. There was an overdraft in abatements which historically has not been appropriated but rather is funded from unappropriated surplus.

NOTE O - JOINT VENTURE:

The towns of Bristol and South Bristol have entered into an interlocal agreement to provide for solid waste disposal facilities for the two communities. The joint venture is administered by a joint board composed of the Board of Selectmen from each town. All costs and revenues are shared in the ratio of 60% - Bristol, 40% - South Bristol.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT & FINANCIALS

Chad Hanna, Chairman • William Benner • Paul Yates

The year 2012 has been generally a quiet year with the very successful transition to a new manager at the Transfer Station and continued improvements at the facility. Bill Benner and Sean Hunter have completed a survey of town roads documenting culvert locations and overall conditions to facilitate future road maintenance planning.

The municipal office continues to run efficiently with the assistance of Town Administrator Kris Poland, Lorraine Rice, Heather Houston, Rachel Burrow and Code Enforcement Officer Merle West. We regret that Merle has announced his intent to retire, but has given us the time to do a thorough selection process before he leaves. We will miss Merle's calm demeanor and dedication.

The town's financial situation remains strong and we would like to thank all of the taxpayers for their continued support. The total debt for the town stands at \$864,774.03 on three notes. The fire truck note is \$369,933.30 (retires 2018), the school renovation bond is \$315,000.00 (retires 2017), and the Partridge Bridge note is for \$179,840.73 (retires 2017). The mil rate for 2012 was reduced from \$7.85 per thousand to \$7.60 per thousand and we are maintaining a healthy surplus which helped us operate in 2012 without obtaining a tax anticipation note. This year due to an increase in the school local appropriation and the uncertainty of state revenue sharing issues we anticipate a small increase in the mill rate for 2013.

Bristol continues as the highest valued town in Lincoln County with a value of approximately 1.2 billion dollars. This also means that Bristol pays the highest portion of the county assessment. Bristol paid approximately \$1,275,000.00 to Lincoln County in 2012.

The town invested approximately \$500,000.00 in road maintenance and upgrades again in 2012. The Pemaquid Harbor Road, Long Cove Point Road and the Martha Beck Road had ditching, culvert replacements and new paving totaling approximately 3.4 miles of paving. Significant work was accomplished on the gravel portions of the Rock School House Road, Split Rock Road and The Sproul Hill Road. The Long Cove Road Bridge and the Day's Bridge on the Back Shore Road received significant repairs based on inspection reports by the Maine Department of Transportation. We are planning on an additional 3.0 miles of paving projects for 2013 and to do repair projects on two additional smaller bridges that require maintenance. The Maine DOT completed their light capital paving projects on the Harrington Road, Huddle Road and Snowball Hill Roads.

This town report is dedicated to Dan Thompson. Dan was a long time local businessman and a quiet and dedicated community supporter. ♦

WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

To Sean M. Hunter, a resident in the Town of Bristol in the County of Lincoln and the State of Maine,

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Bristol, in said County and State, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Bristol Town Hall on Monday the 18th day of March, 2013 at 8:00 AM, then and there to act upon Article 1. The polls for voting on Article 2 shall be opened at 8:00 AM and will close at 8:00 PM. The remaining business to be transacted under this Warrant will be taken up on Tuesday March 19th, 2013 at 7:00 PM at the Bristol Community Gymnasium.

Art. 1 To elect a Moderator by written ballot to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2 To choose by secret ballot the following public officials:

- One (1) Selectman/Assessor/Overseer of the Poor for a 3-year term
- One (1) member of the Parks Commission for a 3-year term
- Two (2) members of the Planning Board for a 3-year term
- Two (2) members of the School Committee for a 3-year term.

Art. 3 To see if the Town will vote to have a twelve member Budget Committee with its members serving staggered three year terms.

This Committee will inquire into and consider every article to be submitted to the voters at any annual or special Town Meeting which provides for the borrowing, raising, transferring and/or appropriation of any sum of money. The Budget Committee shall make its recommendation to the voters. This Committee will be strictly advisory to the voters and will have no role in the development of the budget.

In the first cycle four members would serve for one year, four members would serve for two years, and the remaining four would serve for three years. Thereafter all terms would be three years, with no term limits. There will be no alternates.

The Town Administrator/Board of Selectmen will maintain a list of those registered voters who are interested in serving on this Committee and will periodically throughout the calendar year place a notice of said Committee's status in the local newspaper. Said notice will include a brief job description, how many openings exist (if any) and for what terms.

If accepted by the voters, this policy will be implemented immediately following the 2013 Annual Town Meeting, and those interested in being on the Budget Committee should contact the Town Administrator/ Board of Selectmen who will establish and maintain a list of the volunteers who will, at that time, choose a term of 1, 2, or 3 years.
