Who needs to register for Maine's saltwater fishing registry? If you have a valid Maine freshwater fishing license there is a check box on the freshwater application form for you to indicate that you fish in saltwater. (If you hold a Resident Lifetime license and are 65 years of age or older, you will have to register annually for Maine's saltwater registry.)

If you do not have a valid Maine freshwater license, you must register for a saltwater license at www.maine.gov/saltwater (\$1.00), the Department of Marine Resources (DMR) office, or by any appointed Department of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife agent (\$2.00). Bristol Fire & Rescue Paul Leeman Jr., Fire Chief

Bristol Fire & Rescue responded to 422 emergency calls during 2015. There were 256 medical calls; 67 motor vehicle accidents; 33 fire; 19 fire alarms; 5 water rescue; 18 downed power lines; 11 mutual aid; 2 hazmat; and 11 trees down. The department had 24 less calls than 2014. Members have spent a total of 1361 hours in training to enhance their skills. The members of Bristol Fire & Rescue had a total involvement of 5643.75 hours.

We were pleased to be able to equip all three stations with automatic generators capable of powering each station. The generator at the Bristol Mills station and the Round Pond station were purchased entirely with donation monies. The generator at the New Harbor station was purchased through a grant from FEMA, written by Nobleboro's EMA Director Heidi Leinonen and I, who also serves as Bristol's EMA Director.

For 2016 we will continue to work on challenging the ISO rating set for the Town of Bristol's homeowner's insurance rating which was put on hold due to the draining of the Bristol Mills dam. We will also receive a 2016 Dodge 450 crew cab utility truck with a Fisher Xtreme V plow. This truck is also being purchased entirely with donation monies. This will allow us to plow untreated roads or driveways when we are called to an emergency. The Utility truck will carry an array of tools enabling us to respond to a variety of emergencies without mobilizing the entire fire apparatus.

We continue to participate in the annual Easter egg hunt; the Round Pond 4th of July parade; Olde Bristol Days; Alvin Sproul Samoset Road Race; fire education training with the Bristol School; and the Bristol Mills Fall Festival. The department and many of these projects are supported by the Bristol Ladies Auxiliary. This fine group of people continues to offer their support and fund raising to benefit our department.

It is an honor for all members of Bristol Fire & Rescue to serve the residents of the Town of Bristol. I would like to thank the members for their many hours of dedicated service. Their participation would not be possible without the support of their families who are left at home alone at the sound of a page for Bristol Fire & Rescue. I would like to give a big Thank You to the employers who allow members to respond during working shifts. Remember that we are available every moment of every day throughout the year.

As I begin my seventh year as Fire Chief I want to thank all residents for the privilege of serving in this capacity, and I will continue to do my very best. I want to thank all who continue to support this fine organization through their generous donations. I want everyone to be proud of their Bristol Fire & Rescue.

The Collection of Taxes

Value of Taxable Real Estate \$787,356,545

Assessments are based on the status of property as of April 1st of the tax year. Valuations can be adjusted at any time during April, or until the taxes have been committed to the Tax Collector. Upon commitment, the valuations become permanent record and may be changed only through the abatement process. Tax bills will be mailed to the owner of record as of April 1st, and if known to the Town a copy will be mailed to any new owner. It is interesting to note that in Maine, there is no legal requirement for the Town to provide a tax bill.

The tax due date and the interest rate for late payment are determined by vote of the townspeople at the Annual Town Meeting held in March of each year. In 2016, the Selectmen will recommend September 15th for the due date and 7% for the interest rate on late payments. 7% is the maximum allowable interest rate in 2016 as set by the State Treasurer. Prepayment of taxes in any amount will be accepted at any time.

The Lien Process

Between eight and twelve months after taxes have been committed, the Treasurer will place a lien on all real estate accounts with an unpaid balance. All lien costs must be paid by the delinquent taxpayer before the lien can be discharged. If the lien remains unpaid for 18 months after having been recorded, the Town becomes the owner of the property. At this point the prior owner may negotiate with the Selectmen to buy back the property, or the Town may sell the property at auction.

Homestead Exemption

You are entitled to a Homestead Exemption if:

- You are a legal resident of Maine as of April 1, 2016 and have owned a homestead in the Town of Bristol for at least the past 12 months;
- The property has been your permanent place of residence for the past 12 months;
- It is the only property for which you are claiming a Homestead Exemption.

If you are already receiving this exemption, there is no need to reapply. Applications are available at the Town Office and must be filed by April 1st.

The Fishermen's Museum John Allan, Treasurer

The Museum opened in 2015 for its 43rd season at the Pemaquid Point Lighthouse Park and recorded attendance of 31,963 visitors. We are pleased that so many vacationers and residents continue to enjoy our Museum and the serenity of our beautiful park.

Our website www.thefishermensmuseum.org has photo tours through our galleries and a complete history of the Lighthouse. Many archival documents and photographs are posted including the wreck of the Angel Gabriel, a listing of all of Maine's Lighthouses, How to Catch a Lobster and much more. For 2016, we are hoping to add an aerial video of the lighthouse tower and park grounds. Please visit our website when you can't be there in person.

We continue to set records with the total amount of donations that The Fishermen's Museum has received and given to the Town of Bristol during these years. Our 2015 contribution of \$2,293.13 raises the total funds donated directly to the Town since 1972 to \$258,776.00. The donations we receive go directly to artifact restoration, exhibit maintenance and our small operating budget, with the balance donated to the Town of Bristol. Our Museum posters (suggested donation \$5.00) remain a favorite and our second printing continues to raise funds for our continued operation. Please stop by this year and get one for your wall or as a great gift.

Admission is free and The Museum is open during normal Lighthouse Park hours. Our collection of local fishing heritage includes original tools, traps, nets and artifacts, displays, diorama's, ships logs and first person accounts of shipwrecks, along with rare and unusual items that present the history of the Bristol community to visitors from home and away. We have also placed a number of photographs and other Museum artifacts in the Learning Center. The Museum and Learning Center at Lighthouse Park provide warm and inviting destinations for our friends and visitors all season long.

Our 2015 Educational Scholarship was awarded to Greg Anderson of Bristol. Greg is a graduate of Lincoln Academy, and is enrolled at the Marine Mechanics Institute in Florida where he is studying to become a marine technician. Our annual Scholarship has been awarded since the 1980's and is open to Bristol students who are pursuing a career in marine related activities including boat building, fishing, marine ecology and biology studies, marine engineering and other maritime fields. Information about our scholarship and applications can be obtained at the Lincoln Academy guidance office.

We are again fortunate to have enjoyed the support of a dedicated group of volunteers over the past 43 years. It is through their efforts and the enthusiastic support of the Bristol Parks Commissioners that the Fishermen's Museum has been so successful. Thanks to all who contribute their time and continue to insure that our Museum remains an important educational and cultural destination for visitors and maritime scholars.

Pemaquid Group of Artists Will Kefauver, President

The Pemaquid Group of Artists celebrated 87 years of continuous exhibition during the 2015 season – the last 55 years on the grounds of the beautifully maintained Lighthouse Park. One of the oldest artist organizations in Maine, PGA juries new members from artists residing in area townships of Bristol, South Bristol, Bremen, Newcastle and Damariscotta. Gallery admission is free for park visitors.

We exhibit a diverse collection of artworks – including oil, pastel, watercolor and acrylic paintings, as well as sculpture, ceramics and marquetry. Exhibiting artists continually update their work as others sell. This year we featured the art of 27 permanent members and three seasonal guest artists. We began our season on June 7th with an Opening Reception and from the 8th until October 12th we welcomed visitors and Gallery Patrons on a daily basis. We hosted a reception for Gallery Patrons in August and presented plein air demonstrations for park visitors during Open Lighthouse Day in September.

We continued our support of local arts education through financial donations to three area elementary schools, the preschool program Healthy Kids and Lincoln Academy. We also funded a pass to the Portland Museum of Art, available free to Bristol and other Maine residents by reservation through Skidompha Library in Damariscotta.

We are grateful to our Patron members whose loyal enthusiasm mirrors that of our artist members, Board of Directors and knowledgeable gallery attendants. During 2015, past PGA Board Member and exhibiting artist, Peggy Farrell assumed responsibility of managing the gallery. To improve our visitor experience and ease of operations, the membership funded the construction of a front desk and wrapping station and upgrade to the building's electrical systems. Our website, www.pemaquidartgallery.com, provides information about our artists, events and charitable activities.

Our very active board is comprised of myself, Will Kefauver, President; Paul Sherman, Vice President; Bob Vaughan, Secretary; Judy Nixon, Treasurer; Julie Babb, Claire Hancock, Tony Kilburn, Sally Loughridge and Marlene Loznicka. We hope you will have the opportunity to visit us at the gallery in 2016 to enjoy the creative work of our new and existing members.

Pemaquid Watershed Association Donna Minnis, Executive Director

Since 1966, Pemaquid Watershed Association (PWA) has been conserving the natural resources of the Pemaquid Peninsula through land and water stewardship and education, focusing on the 47 square miles of Pemaquid River watershed. Over half (54.2% or 19.6 square miles) of Bristol is in the Pemaquid River watershed, including Boyd Pond and part of Biscay Pond.

PWA is proud to serve the citizens of Bristol by providing the following services during 2015:

- Staffing and coordinating educational programs at Beachcombers' Rest Nature Center at Pemaquid Beach Park. In the summer of 2015, an estimated 2,079 people visited the nature center, attended a workshop, and/or experienced the weekly touch tank.
- Coordinating the LakeSmart Program, providing free technical assistance to property owners on Biscay Pond to help protect pond water quality.
- Implementing the Courtesy Boat Inspection program to educate boaters about invasive plants and minimize the risk of undesirable plants getting into the ponds and river.
- Providing public access to trails, open space and shorefront via maintenance of six nature preserved in Bristol, attracting tourists to the area and benefitting local residents.
- Maintaining the Bristol Recreational Trail for the Town.
- Funding the Maine Apprentice Gardener (MAG) program at Bristol Consolidated School. The goal of the MAG curriculum is to connect young people with the natural world and with the source of their food. The MAG program is a project of PWA and The University of Maine Cooperative Extension, in collaboration with FARMS (Focus on Agriculture in Rural Maine Schools) and AOS 93.
- Monitoring the water quality at the Bristol Mills Swimming Hole and Pemaquid Beach.

Bristol Area Library Jacqueline Bennett, Librarian

An important goal of the Bristol Area Library is to offer a friendly and welcoming atmosphere. We also strive to provide an expansive collection of books and movies. For these reasons, as well as the number of services and programs we offer, we recorded 9854 adult visitors and 1005 children this past year. We were joined by 91 new members, giving us a present total of 1514 adult and children members.

Some of the services we offer include being a drop-off for the local food pantry, we provide meeting space for local organizations, and we make Ancestry, library edition, available for patrons researching their genealogy. We have a free magazine

table and we sell used books and greeting cards. The Plein Air Group has provided us with passes to the Farnsworth Museum for another year. Computer use and wireless technology continue to be an important service to our patrons. Programs offered for the community this past year included art displays by local artists, knitting for all ages, author visits, story times and our "Every Hero Has a Story" summer reading program for children.

Patrons signed out over 10,100 books and materials; movies were borrowed 3220 times. In addition to the 26,500 items available for checkout, patrons have access to audio books and e-books through the Maine State Library's downloadable program and this past year 458 items were borrowed.

Because of a generous donation from the Peet Foundation, the library was able to install a hard-wired generator, replace the glass on the front desk, and purchase a computer and high quality scanner that will allow us to offer photographs, old documents and oral histories through our website.

This year's Board of Trustees: Judith Hope, President; Kathleen Riess, Vice President; Sue Trouwborst, Recording Secretary; Bonnie Sablinsky, Treasurer and Maggie Conger, Corresponding Secretary. Other trustees are Cathy Chase, Becky Cooper, CarolJaegar, John Marsili, Andrea Powell, Glenn Riker, Mary Stevens, Bruce Swift, Susan Taylor and Eveline Tierney. Our many thanks to Bruce Babb, retiring board member.

Finally, a thank you to our loyal patrons, to our hard-working volunteers with over 2,200 hours of service, to those who gave so generously to our annual appeal and to the Friends of the Bristol Area Library for supporting children's programs and funding our annual appeal. Many thanks also to the town of Bristol for your support of \$14,500 in appropriations, which is a very crucial part of our operating budget.

Old Bristol Historical Society Belinda Osier, President

Formed in 2003, the OBHS is a charitable and educational nonprofit corporation whose purpose is to collect, preserve, and share for the benefit of the public the artifacts and the oral, documentary, personal, and physical histories of our community. By involving local people and institutions it aims to foster a sense of community and pride in our collective past and future.

In 2015 OBHS added a number of important items to its collection. Among the donations received were old diaries, photographs, club records, and genealogical records. A special initiative was undertaken to make sure that items are being properly preserved and cared for which included re-housing photographs and paper materials in archival acid-free folders and boxes. All photographs and documents are also being digitally scanned to reduce the deterioration that comes from frequent handling. Our collections also benefitted this year from the launch of our new Digital Image Archive, which allows people to share historically

important photographs with OBHS while still retaining ownership. As this archive grows, OBHS plans to eventually make it available online. Our preservation efforts also include maintaining the historic McKinley Schoolhouse which this year received some new paint, improved outdoor lighting, and new shingles on the outbuilding.

This year OBHS extended its educational outreach in diverse directions. In the spring we visited with 5th grade students at BCS and posed the question "Should Bristol celebrate its Sestercentennial and why?" Seventeen students responded with written essays that celebrated Bristol's unique history; in the fall we returned to honor those students with merit certificates and also to introduce colonial reenactor Russ Guibord who addressed the students in colonial persona and garb.

Over the summer OBHS sponsored four well-attended public lectures, which complemented the theme of Bristol's Sestercentennial and co-sponsored a concert by Castlebay, which used both song and lecture to illuminate our town's history. We also shared Bristol's history with numerous individuals who stopped by our booth during Olde Bristol Days.

Finally, throughout the year OBHS reached growing numbers of people through virtual media. Weekly postings on our new Facebook page are now viewed by over 280 followers and the total number of hits on our website has grown to over 28k.

Our current Board of Directors is comprised of Belinda Osier and Chuck Rand, Co-Presidents; Daniel Purdy, Vice-President; Debbie Mikulak, Secretary; Don Means, Treasurer; Robert Ives, A.J. Lockhart, Kathy Wright, Mollie Perley, Larry Hayter, Margaret Hayter, and Honorary Directors Kay Hannah and Pete Hannah.

CLC Adult Education *Ellen Dickens, Director*

CLC Adult and Community Education again provided services to over 800 adults in 2015. We offered the HiSET high school completion program, assisted adults in preparing for college, worked with literacy students, provided medical certificate programs and served up a wide variety of enrichment classes for young and old.

We provide basic literacy services along with high school completion classes free of charge in our Learning Center program on Tuesday and Thursday evenings and Monday and Tuesday mornings. Free College Transitions courses are offered through The Lincoln County College Connection (TLC3) – a cooperative program with 3 other Lincoln County Adult Education programs. Dozens of adults from Lincoln County participated in classes that will help them prepare for college through that program.

In 2014-15 we had 6 students complete a high school credential and another 25 worked towards a high school diploma or on basic language and math skills. Anyone 17 or older who is out of school and wants to earn a high school credential

or who needs to improve their reading, writing or English language skills should contact us to get started.

We continue to work with Lincoln County Healthcare to provide vocational training in several medical programs. In 2014-15 we conducted 3 Certified Nursing Assistant courses with 21 students completing the program and receiving certification and employment. We were also able to offer 7 CPR, CRMA and PSS classes with 33 people receiving certification.

Hundreds of students continue to enjoy the more than 120 low-cost, high impact courses offered in Community Education. This fall we combined our brochure with the RSU40 Adult Ed brochure to further expand our classroom choices and to provide a single point of information for classes throughout Lincoln County.

Chris Kenoyer of Alna: producer of the CLC YMCA Annual Meeting, Downtown and Locally Owned Businesses Forum and Maine's Economy and Climate Change. Chris also created and produced a promo for Hidden Valley Nature Center. Students from Lincoln Academy's digital media production class: several creative Student Film Shorts, highlights of the Senior Trip to Costa Rica, the Baccalaureate, music from The Lincolnaires, A Tour of the LA Campus and the Lincoln Academy Graduation.

New Developments:

LCTV has been steadily adding to our online archive of locally produced shows by converting and uploading videos produced prior to late 2010, including Lincoln Academy Basketball tournament and championship games, Art Mayer's *Lincoln County Oral History* and *Wuzzup Classics*.

LCTV was fortunate to have two summer interns, Sammy Zaidi and Kyle Livingston. Sammy helped develop our new website, coming online in 2016 and Kyle helped repair and update our computer hardware.

After retiring for the second and last (we hope!) time, David Svens moved back to Bristol (Chamberlain). Dave has an extensive background in television production and gives generously of his time and talent to LCTV, local producers and the Town of Bristol. Dave produced a video of the *Seacoast Community Orchestra* concert held at the Lincoln Theater with the help of camera crew Tam Green and Athena Taylor.

LCTV purchased three high definition cameras. At the current time, Time Warner Cable TV and Tidewater IPTV only send out our video in standard definition, but LCTV does upload the high definition version to LCTV's Video on Demand webpage: www.lctv.org/vod.html.

Bristol Parks & Recreation

The Bristol Parks Commission oversees the care of Pemaquid Lighthouse Park, Pemaquid Beach Park, Ellingwood Park Visitors Center, Hanna Landing, New Harbor Landing, the Bristol Mills Dam and Swimming Area, Moxie Cove Landing and Picnic Area, Pemaquid Falls Boat Launch and Picnic Area and the Old Rock Schoolhouse. Lighthouse Park and Beach Park generate 75% of the revenue and the remainder comes from fundraising efforts, resident passes, weddings and events and grants. Bristol Parks does not receive funding which is raised through taxation.

2015 proved to be an interesting year. During the months of heavy snow, the ticket booth met a disastrous fate after being struck by a snow plow. The new booth, although not completely finished, was ready for opening day in May. More work was done during the fall and finishing touches are planned for 2016.

A new event in July was met with enthusiasm when Parks staff hosted a lobster bake at Beach Park. The Commissioners plan to repeat this event in 2016. The beach buggy is a huge success and is used almost daily by those who were unable to get onto the beach in the past. The Learning Center/Art Gallery path was hottopped for guests with mobility concerns, complimented by a new bed of lilies. The computers at Lighthouse Park and Ellingwood Park were upgraded and a third was purchased for live-streaming of movies and other events in the Learning Center. Wi-fi is now available at Lighthouse Park, Beach Park and Ellingwood Park.

Free movie Tuesday and the educational speakers program at the Learning Center at Lighthouse Park will continue in 2016. A new platform at Beach Park was ready in time for the Pete Collins concert. AzIz provided entertainment a few nights later for the 250th Fireworks Extravaganza, made possible from the sale of t-shirts with a design by Glenn Chadbourne. These tees are still available.

The crew cut pickets and built a new fence at Lighthouse Park during the fall and it will be painted in the spring of 2016. At the beach, new fences were built and painted during the spring.

With the increase in revenue, the Parks Commissioners plan to do much needed plumbing updates to the bathrooms at Lighthouse Park and Beach Park. Tile work is scheduled to be done at Lighthouse Park. At the beach, the bandstand is scheduled to be completed.

At the end of the season, Pemaquid Point was the site for an advertising shoot. "Lights Across America" can be seen on YouTube, if you have not already seen the footage. Facebook visitors to both pages maintained by Bristol Parks continues to increase. Events are posted for your convenience on Facebook.

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate. I am grateful for the trust the people of our State have placed in me and welcome this opportunity to share some key accomplishments from 2015.

This provision permanently changed the federal law that previously had forced the heaviest trucks onto our country roads and downtown streets, rather than allowing them to use Maine's federal Interstates. In addition, I was glad to help secure another significant award for the University of Maine's deepwater offshore wind initiative, which has the potential to advance an emerging industry and create thousands of good jobs in our state.

Maine's historic contributions to our nation's defense must continue. In 2015, I secured funding toward a much-needed additional Navy destroyer, likely to be built at Bath Iron Works. Modernization projects at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard that I have long advocated for were also completed, as were projects for the Maine National Guard.

I was also deeply involved in crafting the new education reform law to better empower states and communities in setting educational policy for their students. The law also extends a program I co-authored that provides additional assistance to rural schools, which has greatly benefitted our state. A \$250 tax deduction I authored in 2002 for teachers who spend their own money on classroom supplies was also made permanent last year.

As a result of a scientific evaluation of the nutritional value of potatoes required by a law that I wrote, the wholesome fresh potato finally was included in the federal WIC nutrition program. I also worked on other issues important to Maine's farmers and growers, including research on wild blueberries and pollinating bees.

As Chairman of the Housing Appropriations Subcommittee, I have made combating veterans' homelessness a priority. This year's housing funding law includes \$60 million for 8,000 new supportive housing vouchers for homeless veterans. Since this program began in 2008, the number of homeless veterans nationwide has dropped by one third. Maine has received nearly 200 vouchers to support homeless veterans.

Last year, I became Chairman of the Senate Aging Committee. My top three priorities for the committee are retirement security, investing more in biomedical research, and fighting fraud and financial abuses targeting our nation's seniors. I advocated for the \$2 billion increase in funding for the National Institutes of Health to advance research on such diseases as diabetes and Alzheimer's. The Senate also unanimously passed my bill to support family caregivers. The Aging Committee's toll-free hotline (1-855-303-9470) makes it easier for senior citizens

to report suspected fraud and receive assistance and has already received more than 1,000 calls.

A Maine value that always guides me is our unsurpassed work ethic. As 2015 ended, I cast my 6,072nd consecutive vote, continuing my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997.

It has been a privilege to serve the State of Maine since being sworn into the U.S. Senate.

Much of my time in Washington this past year has been devoted to the Senate Armed Services Committee and the Select Committee on Intelligence. Protecting our homeland and the people of Maine from terrorism and violence remains one of my top priorities. Through my work on the Armed Services Committee, I was able to secure several provisions in the 2016 National Defense Authorization Act that benefit Maine. The legislation authorizes the construction of an additional DDG-51 Arleigh Burke Class Destroyer that could be built at Bath Iron Works and expands the HUBZone program to stimulate economic growth at former military installations like the former Brunswick Naval Air Station.

Returning control to teachers, school districts, and states has also been a primary concern of mine. I am encouraged that the Every Student Succeeds Act has become law. It eliminates the burdensome requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act and ensures access to a quality education for all students. A provision I helped author in the bill will give states the opportunity to pilot the use of their own proficiency-based assessments in lieu of federally-mandated standardized tests. Also included in the bill are several measures I secured to promote local input, fund education technology initiatives, and explore new strategies to increase student access to the internet outside of school.

Communities across Maine have taken bold action to improve their broadband connectivity, and I have been proud to foster federal support for these types of projects. My amendments to the Every Student Succeeds Act will promote the type of work already occurring in Washington County, where students who lack broadband access are able to check out mobile hotspots from their local libraries. Additionally, a bill I co-sponsored, the Community Broadband Act, helped pave the way for the FCC to enact rules protecting the ability of municipalities to invest in better broadband. I am excited by Maine's leadership on this important economic development issue and will continue to support local efforts in this area.

After extensive negotiations, the Senate passed a five-year transportation bill

that will increase highway and transit funding in Maine and provide stability to improve our transportation infrastructure. The legislation contains provisions I cosponsored to cut red tape and improve predictability and timeliness by streamlining the federal permitting process for large infrastructure projects. Also incorporated in this bill are my provisions to relieve financial regulations on Maine's community banks and credit unions and to reauthorize the Export-Import Bank, a critical tool that supports communities and small business across the state.

Following my inquiries in the Energy and Natural Resources Committee, the National Parks Service has announced they will begin exploring strategies to allow park visitors to purchase electronic passes online and will pilot the program at Acadia National Park. These passes would improve access to our nation's most treasured landscapes and would generate resources for years to come. I remain deeply engaged in preserving Maine's natural beauty and strengthening our outdoor recreation economy.

It is with solemn responsibility that I have focused my energy addressing the opioid epidemic in Maine. This work includes convening roundtables with a wide-range of health care and law enforcement professionals to combat addiction; introducing a proposal to safely dispose of excess prescription drugs; cosponsoringa Senate-passed bill that addresses mothers struggling with addiction and the alarming effect it has on newborns; co-sponsoring the TREAT Act, which expands the ability of medical specialists to provide life-saving medication-assisted therapies for patients battling heroin and prescription drug addiction; and calling on the Commander of the U.S. Southern Command to increase efforts to stop the flow of heroin at our southern border.

I like to think of Maine as a big small town – and in a small town, the leaders are accessible and eager to listen. In that spirit, I've made it a priority to stay connected with people from all over Maine who e-mail, write, and call with suggestions or questions. If I can ever assist in your interaction with a federal agency, or you have thoughts, concerns, or personal input on a matter that is currently before Congress, I hope you will contact me, let me know where you stand, and engage in this critical part of democracy.

As always, I am honored to represent the people of Maine and look forward to working with you for the betterment of our great state.

I hope this letter finds you and your family well. I appreciate the opportunity to give you an update on my work in Maine and Washington. It continues to be a great honor to serve the people of Maine's 1st District in Congress.

Over the last year, I have introduced a number of bills to address the problems my constituents face. One of the most concerning issues is hunger. Nearly 50 million Americans don't have reliable access to enough food. At the same time, 40 percent

of the food produced in the country goes to waste. That is why I introduced the Food Recovery Act, comprehensive legislation to cut food waste while providing more food to the people who need it.

The Safe and Affordable Drugs from Canada Act takes on another serious concern for Maine families – the high cost of prescription drugs. Here at home, I had the chance to visit many communities to help celebrate their victories and discuss their concerns – critical feedback to take to Washington. And over the last year, my hard-working staff has helped hundreds of constituents on their issues with federal programs and agencies.

Bristol School & Superintendent's Report

The 2015-2016 school year is in full swing with over half the year completed at this point. Our students are busy reading, writing, calculating, experimenting, thinking and engaging in all types of learning. We have a strong academic program that covers the state curriculum expectations, but doesn't stop there! We have strong enrichment and remedial programs as well as a variety of co-curricular options for students. This is our third year of offering an accelerated middle school math program for 7th and 8th graders. Students who participate in these classes are eligible to place in more advanced classes at the high school level. Last year all of our 8th grade participants were able to take the honors geometry class during their 9th grade year! Our students benefit from robotics club, choral groups, band ensembles, archery, art buddies, a student newspaper, yearbook club, an after-school learning lab and Gizmos (aka: programming and design) to name a few. In addition to the co-curricular choices we offer at least 8 athletic teams for students to participate in.

Bristol School classrooms continue to benefit from ever evolving technologies that stretch our students' learning. We are often amazed at the ease at which these students can apply the new technologies to improve their learning. Students have been surprising the staff with the creations they have designed using the school's new 3-D printer. Students identify items that can solve problems or enhance our classrooms and then design them, using programs on the iPads. Rather than waiting to see what teachers need to enhance students' learning, we have found that bringing new technologies to the students first has allowed them to show us how they can construct knowledge with these new tools. With this incredible access, we also work to support our students and families in making appropriate choices to keep students safe. We continue to explore ways to stay "caught up" with the technology in our ever-changing world.

This year we have placed a greater focus on connecting with parents and the community. Bristol School should be a welcoming environment for parents as well as students. The Parent-Teacher Organization has a bigger presence at school organizing events for students and families, as well as raising funds for important programs. A number of school events organized by a group of teachers has begun to strengthen the sense of community within the school and with the families of BCS. The Bristol YMCA night, Devil Pride Week with the community cook out, Fall Fun Day and the Thanksgiving meal served by our kitchen staff were all examples of home-school connections that we celebrated this past year and hope will become school traditions. The school board has spearheaded a long-range planning process that will culminate in a BCS Strategic Plan. This work was done with a group of stakeholders from the community over the past 10 months and represents the interests the group has for our students and the school in the future. We look forward to implementing these plans over the next few years.

The physical plant continues to get the necessary attention as we plan to upgrade the heating control system in the near future. The gym walls are nearly complete with the melamine resurfacing and the gym floors will be fully refinished this summer. The next big project will be a parking lot upgrade to improve the flow of traffic and improve the drainage in front of the building.

Bristol Consolidated School students continue to make growth in many areas. This past summer we hosted a summer school for students in grades K-6 who needed academic support to be successful. The program had strong parental support and was able to keep students from falling behind over the summer break. We are pleased with the progress we are making and recognize the need for continued growth in the future.

Grades 9 - 12: Bristol has 101 students in grades 9-12, with 91 attending Lincoln Academy and ten (10) students attending other school opportunities. These students continue to achieve to high levels. Lincoln Academy continues a very high placement level of students seeking post-secondary learning. Central Office Administrators of the AOS meet with the Head of School of Lincoln Academy and his Assistants a couple times per year in order to align curriculum and refine plans to prepare our grade eight students for a successful transition and experience at the Academy.

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Bristol, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2015 and 2014, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the Table of Contents.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinions.

Opinions

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Bristol as of December 31, 2015 and 2014, and the respective changes in financial position, and where applicable, cash flows thereof for the years then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Other Matters

Required Supplementary Information

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the management's discussion and analysis and budgetary comparison information be presented

to supplement the basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquiries of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance. *January 22, 2016*

Management's Discussion and Analysis

Fiscal Year Ended December 31, 2015

The Municipal Officers of the Town of Bristol, Maine offer the readers of Bristol's financial statements this narrative overview and analysis of its financial activities for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2015. We encourage readers to consider the information presented in conjunction with additional information furnished in the basic financial statements and the accompanying notes to those financial statements.

The Financial Statements

The financial statements presented herein include all activities of the Town of Bristol, Maine using the integrated approach as prescribed by GASB (Governmental Accounting Standards Board) Statement No. 34. The government-wide financial statements present the financial picture of the Town using the accrual basis of accounting. They present governmental activities (functions that are principally supported by taxes and intergovernmental revenues) and business-type activities (functions that are intended to recover all or a significant portion of their costs through user fees and charges) separately. These statements include all assets of the Town as well as all liabilities, including long-term debt.

The fund financial statements include statements for each of the three categories of activity: governmental, business-type and fiduciary. Notes to the financial statements provide additional information that is essential to a full understanding of the data provided in the government-wide and fund financial statements.

Statement of Net Assets and Statement of Activities

The statement of net assets and statement of activities report information about the Town and its activities as a whole. Excluding infrastructure, these statements include all assets and liabilities of the Town using the accrual basis of accounting, which is similar to the accounting used by most private-sector companies. All of the current year's revenues and expenses are taken into account regardless of when cash is received or paid.

These two statements report the Town's net assets and changes in them. Net assets are the difference between assets and liabilities, which is one way to measure the Town's financial health or financial position. Over time, increases and decreases in net assets are one indicator of whether the Town's financial health is improving or deteriorating. Other factors to consider are changes in the Town's property tax base and the condition of its infrastructure. In the statement of net assets and statement of activities, the Town's activities are separated as follows:

Governmental activities: Most of the Town's basic services are reported in this category, including public safety, public works, and general administrative services. Property taxes,

excise taxes, user fees, interest income, cable television franchise fees and State and Federal grants finance these activities.

Business-type activities: Parks and Recreation is considered a "business-type" activity. A fee is charged to visitors to cover costs associated with admission to and use of Bristol's parks. Parks and Recreation is completely self-supporting through admissions, rental income and other user fees and donations.

Fund Financial Statements

The fund financial statements provide detailed information about the most significant funds, not the Town as a whole. A fund is a grouping of related accounts used to maintain control over resources that have been segregated for specific activities or objectives. Some funds are required to be established by State law or by grantor. In the Town of Bristol, these include worthy poor funds, cemetery funds and a small fund set aside for maintenance of the Rock Schoolhouse. Management, however, establishes other funds to help it control and manage money for particular purposes. During fiscal year 2015 Bristol had thirteen "capital reserve" accounts: the Bridge Fund, the Building Fund, the Computer Fund, the Fish Ladder Fund, the Highway Equipment Fund, the Landings and Harbors Fund, the Olde Bristol Days Fund, the Revaluation Fund, the Parks Fund, the Learning Center Fund, the School HVAC Fund, the Fire Truck Fund and the Facility Maintenance Fund which offsets capital expenditures for Bristol's three fire stations.

Governmental Funds

Most of the Town's basic services are reported in governmental funds, which focus on how money flows into and out of those funds and the remaining balances at year end that are available for spending. These funds are reported using an accounting method called "modified accrual", which measures cash and all other financial assets that can be readily converted to cash. The governmental fund statements provide a detailed, shorter-term view of the Town's general government operations and the basic services it provides. Governmental fund information helps determine whether there are more or fewer financial resources that can be spent in the near future to finance the Town's programs. The Town's governmental funds consist of the following:

General Fund: The general operating fund of the Town used to account for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund.

Proprietary Funds: When the Town charges customers for services it provides (business-type activities), these services are generally reported in proprietary funds. Proprietary funds are reported in the same way that all activities are reported in the Statement of Net Assets and Statement of Activities.

Fiduciary Funds: The Town's fiduciary funds are held in trust for the benefit of others. These funds are not included in the government-wide financial statements and cannot be used to support general government activities and operations.

Governmental Activities

The cost of all governmental activities in 2015 was \$7,570,800.65, an increase of \$113,133.15 in comparison to 2014. Some of the costs were paid by those who directly benefited from the programs, or by other governments and organizations that subsidized certain programs with operating grants and contributions. The Town paid for the "public benefit" portion of governmental activities with property taxes and through additional sources such as excise tax, interest revenue, State revenue sharing, cable television franchise fees and other miscellaneous revenues.

Town programs include education, general government, health and welfare, highways and bridges, protection, special assessments (County tax), and unclassified. Each program's net cost (total cost less revenues generated by activities) is presented below. The net costs show the financial burden placed on the Town's taxpayers by each of the functions:

On December 31, 2015, Bristol's net position for governmental activities totaled \$9,540,057.44. Net assets as of December 31, 2014 were \$9,103,332.82. The result is an increase in net assets of \$436,724.62 during fiscal year 2015.

Business-Type Activities

The cost of the Town's only proprietary fund, Bristol Parks and Recreation, was \$304,999.50. The amount paid by users of the system and raised through donations was \$313,424.46, resulting in a net gain of \$8,424.96.

Budgets and Budgetary Accounting

The breakdown of actual expenditures for the year may be found in the Selectmen's Financial Report which is part of the 2015 Annual Report of the Town of Bristol. This could be compared with the proposed budget for 2016 to ascertain potential increases or decreases in individual budgetary items.

Administrative Notes

Bristol had four outstanding loans at the end of fiscal year 2015: a bond for school renovations which matures in 2018, a loan for the Partridge Bridge which matures in 2017, and two fire truck loans maturing in 2018 and 2023. The following is a comparison of total long-term debt as of December 31st of each fiscal year:

The mill rate increased from 7.70 per 1,000.00 of valuation in fiscal year 2013 and 7.90 per 1,000.00 of valuation in fiscal year 2014 to 8.45 per 1,000.00 of valuation in fiscal year 2015.

Education accounted for approximately 66% of the tax commitment followed by the County tax assessment at 18% and the Municipal budget at 16%.

Bristol's financial position continues to be exemplary. The Municipal Officers continue to pursue ways to lower the cost of providing essential services to Bristol's taxpayers while preparing for demands on infrastructure, increasing cost of education, the County tax commitment, decreased State revenues, and State and Federal mandates.

Notes to Financial Statements

NOTE A - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

The accounting policies of the Town of Bristol conform to generally accepted accounting principles as applicable to governmental units.

1. Financial Reporting Entity

The Town of Bristol was incorporated in 1765. The Town operates under a town meeting form of government.

In evaluating the Town of Bristol as a reporting entity, management has addressed all potential component units. The primary criteria for including a component reporting entity are the exercise of financial accountability by the Town of Bristol's municipal officials.

The Town's financial statements are prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) is responsible for establishing Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) for state and local governments through its pronouncements (Statements and Interpretations). Governments are also required to follow the pronouncements of the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued through November 30, 1989 (when applicable) that do not conflict with or contradict GASB pronouncements. The more significant accounting policies established in GAAP are used by the Town as discussed below.

In June 1999, the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) unanimously approved Statement No. 34, *Basic Financial Statements – and Management's Discussion and Analysis – for State and Local Governments*. Certain significant changes in the Statement include the following:

- 1.) Financial statements now include:
- A Management's Discussion and Analysis (MD&A) section providing an analysis of the Town's overall financial position and results of operations.
- Financial statements prepared using full accrual accounting for all of the Town's activities, including infrastructure (roads, bridges, etc.).
- 2.) A change in the fund financial statements to focus on the major funds.

2. Basic Financial Statements - Government-Wide Statements

The Town's basic financial statements include both government-wide (reporting the Town as a whole) and fund financial statements (reporting the Town's major funds). Both the government-wide and fund financial statements categorize primary activities as governmental. The Town's fire protection, recreation, public works, and general administrative services are classified as governmental activities.

In the government-wide Statements of Net Position, the governmental column is presented on a consolidated basis by column, and is reported on a full accrual, economic resource basis, which recognizes all long-term assets and receivables as well as long-term debt and obligations. The Town's net position is reported in three parts - net invested in capital assets; restricted; and unrestricted. The Town first utilizes restricted resources to finance qualifying activities.

The government-wide Statements of Activities reports both the gross and net cost of each of the Town's functions and business-type activities (fire, public works, administrative, etc.). The functions are also supported by general government revenues (property, certain

intergovernmental revenues, fines, permits, and charges, etc.). The Statements of Activities reduces gross expenses (including depreciation) by related program revenues and operating and capital grants. Program revenues must be directly associated with the function (fire, public works, etc.). Operating grants include operating-specific and discretionary (either operating or capital) grants while the capital grants column reflects capital-specific grants.

The net costs (by function or business-type activity) are normally covered by general revenue (property, intergovernmental revenues, interest income, etc.).

This government-wide focus is more on the sustainability of the Town as an entity and the change in the Town's net position resulting from the current year's activities.

3. Basic Financial Statements - Fund Financial Statements

The financial transactions of the Town are reported in individual funds in the fund financial statements. Each fund is accounted for by providing a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, reserves, fund equity, revenues, and expenditures/expenses. The various funds are reported by generic classification within the financial statements.

The following fund types are used by the Town:

a. Governmental Funds:

The focus of the governmental funds' measurement (in the fund statements) is upon determination of financial position and changes in financial position (sources, uses, and balances of financial resources) rather than upon net income. The following is a description of the governmental funds of the Town:

1. General Fund:

General Fund is the general operating fund of the town. It is used to account for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund.

2. Capital Projects:

Capital Projects funds are used to account for financial resources to be used for the acquisition or construction of major capital facilities and equipment.

3. Fiduciary Funds:

Fiduciary Funds are used to report assets held in a trustee or agency capacity for others and therefore are not available to support town programs. The reporting focus is on net assets and changes in net assets and is reported using accounting principles similar to proprietary funds.

The emphasis in fund financial statements is on the major funds in either the governmental or business-type activities categories. Nonmajor funds by category are summarized into a single column. GASB No. 34 sets forth minimum criteria (percentage of the assets, liabilities, revenues, or expenditures/expenses of either fund category) for the determination of major funds.

The Town's fiduciary funds are presented in the fiduciary fund financial statements. Since by definition these assets are being held for the benefit of a third party and cannot be used to address activities or obligations of the government, these funds are not incorporated into the government-wide statements.

4. Proprietary Fund:

The Proprietary Fund is the fund used to account for all financial resources relating to the Parks and Recreation Department. The generally accepted accounting principles applicable are those similar to business in the private sector.

4. Basis of Accounting

Basis of accounting refers to the point at which revenues or expenditures/expenses are recognized in the accounts and reported in the financial statements. It relates to the timing of the measurements made regardless of the measurement focus applied:

a. Accrual:

Governmental activities in the government-wide financial statements and fiduciary fund financial statements are presented on the accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recognized when incurred.

b. Modified Accrual:

The governmental funds financial statements are presented on the modified accrual basis of accounting. Under the modified accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recorded when susceptible to accrual; i.e. both measurable and available. "Available" means collectible within the current period or within 60 days after year end. Expenditures are generally recognized under the modified accrual basis of accounting when the related liability is incurred. The exception to this general rule is that principal and interest on general obligation long-term debt, if any, is recognized when due.

5. Financial Statement Amounts

a. Cash and Cash Equivalents:

The Town has defined cash and cash equivalents to include cash on hand, demand deposits, and cash with fiscal agents. Statutes authorize the Treasurer of the Town, as directed by the municipal officers, to invest all municipal funds, including reserve and trust funds, to the extent that the terms of the instrument, order, or article creating the fund do not prohibit the investment in financial institutions as described in Section 5706 MRSA and securities as described in Sections 5711 through 5717 MRSA.

b. Capital Assets:

Capital assets purchased or acquired with an original cost of \$2,000.00 or more are reported at historical cost or estimated historical cost. Contributed assets are reported at fair market value as of the date received. Additions, improvements, and other capital outlays that significantly extend the useful life of an asset are capitalized. Other costs incurred for repairs and maintenance are expensed as incurred. Depreciation on all assets is provided on the straight-line basis over the following estimated useful lives:

Buildings 20-50 Years
Machinery and Equipment 5-10 Years
Improvements 10-20 Years
Other Infrastructure 10-50 Years

c. Revenues:

Substantially, all governmental fund revenues are accrued. Property taxes are billed and collected within the same period in which the taxes are levied. In applying GASB No. 33 to grant revenues, the provider recognizes liabilities and expenses and the recipient recognizes receivables and revenue when the applicable eligibility requirements, including time requirements, are met. Resources transmitted before the eligibility requirements are met are reported as advances by the provider and deferred revenue by the recipient.

d. Expenditures:

Expenditures are recognized when the related fund liability is incurred.

e. Deferred Inflows and Outflows of Resources:

In addition to assets, the Statement of Net Position will sometimes report a separate section

for deferred outflows of resources. This separate financial statement element, deferred outflows of resources, represents a consumption of net position that applies to a future period(s) and so will not be recognized as an outflow of resources (expense) until that time. The deferred outflows relate to the net pension liability, which include the Town's contributions subsequent to the measurement date, which is recognized as a reduction of the net pension liability in the subsequent year. They also include changes in assumptions, differences between expected and actual experience, and changes in proportion and differences between Town contributions and proportionate share of contributions, which are deferred and amortized over the average expected remaining service lives of active and inactive members in the plan.

In addition to liabilities, the statement of net position will sometimes report a separate section for deferred inflows of resources. This separate financial statement element, deferred inflows of resources, represents an acquisition of net position that applies to a future period(s) and so will not be recognized as an inflow of resources (revenue) until that time. The deferred inflows relate to the net pension liability, which include the differences between expected and actual experience and changes in proportion and differences between Town contributions and proportionate share of contributions, which is deferred and amortized over the average expected remaining service lives of active and inactive members in the plan. They also include the net difference between projected and actual earnings on pension plan investments, which is deferred and amortized over a five-year period.

f. Use of Estimates:

The presentation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE B - CASH:

The Town's cash is categorized to give an indication of the level of risk assumed by the Town at year end. These Categories are defined as follows:

Category #1 - Insured or collateralized with securities held by the Town or by its agent in the Town's name.

Category #2 - Collateralized with securities held by the pledging financial institution's trust department or agent in the Town's name.

Category #3 - Uncollateralized (This includes any bank balance that is collateralized with securities held by the pledging financial institution, or by its trust department or agent but not in the Town's name.)

NOTE E - GENERAL FUND BUDGET:

The Town operates on a net budget as compared with a gross budget. All revenues are not estimated, but are credited to the particular operating account. Certain revenues are dedicated for particular purposes by vote of the townspeople at the annual town meeting or at special town meetings.

At the annual town meeting, held in March of each year, the townspeople vote on various articles on which amounts for appropriations have been recommended by the Board of Selectmen and/or the budget committee.

NOTE F - ASSIGNED FOR OTHER PURPOSES:

Historically, the townspeople vote to carry certain departmental unexpended balances forward to the following year for expenditure. This is usually in lieu of additional appropriations in any particular account.

NOTE G - REVENUE RECOGNITION - PROPERTY TAXES:

The Town's property tax for the current year was levied June 5, 2015 on the assessed value listed as of April 1, 2015 for all taxable real and personal property located in the Town. Taxes were due September 15, 2015 with interest at 7% per annum or part thereof commencing September 16, 2015.

Tax liens are filed against delinquent real estate taxpayers after eight months but within one year of the original tax commitment. If the tax, interest, and costs have not been paid eighteen months after the filing of a lien certificate then the lien is automatically foreclosed.

The National Council on Governmental Accounting (N.C.G.A.) Interpretation No. 3 requires that property tax revenue be recognized only to the extent it will be collected within sixty days following the year end. The deferred tax revenue shown on the balance sheet represents property taxes not expected to be collected within sixty days after the year end.

Property taxes are recognized when they become available. Available includes those taxes expected to be collected within sixty days after year end as stated above.

NOTE H - MAINE PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM:

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Pensions - For purposes of measuring the net pension liability, deferred outflows of resources and deferred inflows for resources related to pensions, and pension expense, information about the fiduciary net position of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System State Employee and Teacher Plan (SETP Plan) and additions to/deductions from the Plan's fiduciary net position have been determined on the same basis as they are reported by the Plans. For this purpose, benefit payments (including refunds of employee contributions) are recognized when due and payable in accordance with the benefit terms. Investments are reported at fair value.

Maine Public Employees Retirement System

General Information about the Pension Plan

Plan Description - Teaching-certified employees of the Town of Bristol are provided with pensions through the Maine Public Employees Retirement System State Employee and Teacher Plan (SETP Plan), cost-sharing multiple-employer defined benefit pension plans, administered by the Maine Public Employees Retirement System (MPERS). Benefit terms are established in Maine statute. MPERS issues a publicly available financial report that can be obtained at www.mainepers.org.

Benefits provided - The SETP Plan provide defined retirement benefits based on members' average final compensation and service credit earned as of retirement. Vesting (i.e. eligibility for benefits upon reaching qualification) occurs upon the earning of five years of service credit. In some cases, vesting occurs on the earning of one year of service credit

immediately preceding retirement at or after normal retirement age. For SETP members, normal retirement age is 60, 62, or 65. The normal retirement age is determined by whether a member had met certain creditable service requirements on specific dates, as established by statute. The monthly benefit of members who retire before normal retirement age by virtue of having at least 25 years of service credit is reduced by a statutorily prescribed factor for each year of age that a member is below her/his normal retirement age at retirement. MPERS also provides disability and death benefits, which are established by statute.

Contributions - Employee contribution rates are defined by law or Board rule and depend on the terms of the plan under which an employee is covered. Employer contributions are determined by actuarial valuations. The contractually required contribution rates are actuarially determined as an amount that, when combined with employee contributions, is expected to finance the costs of benefits earned by employees during the year, with an additional amount to finance any unfunded accrued liability.

SETP Plan - Maine statute requires the State to contribute a portion of the Town's contractually required contributions. Employees are required to contribute 7.65% of their annual pay. The Town of Bristol's contractually required contribution rate for the year ended December 31, 2015, was between 13.38% and 15.68% of annual payroll of which between 2.65% and 3.36% of payroll was required from the Town and \$187,542.78 was required from the State. Contributions to pension plan from the Town was \$42,333.80 for the year ended December 31, 2015.

Pension Liabilities, Pension Expense, and Deferred Outflows and Deferred Inflows of Resources Related to Pensions

The net pension liabilities were measured as of June 30, 2014 and the total pension liabilities used to calculate the net pension liabilities were determined by actuarial valuations as of that date. The Town's proportion of the net pension liabilities were based on projections of the Town's long-term share of contributions to the pension plans relative to the projected contributions of all participating School Administrative Units and the State (SETP Plan), actuarially determined.

SETP Plan - At June 30, 2014, the Town reported a liability for its proportionate share of the net pension liability that reflected a reduction for State pension support provided to the Town. The amount recognized by the Town as its proportionate share of the net pension liability, the related State support, and the total portion of the net pension liability that was associated with the Town were as follows:

The long-term expected rate of return on pension plan investments was determined using a building-block method in which best-estimate ranges of expected future real rates of return (expected returns, net of pension plan investment expense and inflation) are developed for each major asset class. These ranges are combined to produce the long-term expected rate of return by weighing the expected future real rates of return by the target asset allocation percentage and by adding expected inflation. Discount Rate - The discount rate used to measure the total pension liability was 7.125% for the SETP Plan. The projection of cash flows used to determine the discount rates

assumed that employee contributions will be made at the current contribution rate and that contributions from participating local districts will be made at contractually required rates, actuarially determined. Based on these assumptions, the pension plans' fiduciary net position was projected to be available to make all projected future benefit payments of current active and inactive employees. Therefore, the long-term expected rate of return on pension plan investments was applied to all periods of projected benefit payments to determine the total pension liabilities.

NOTE K - RISK MANAGEMENT:

The Town is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts; theft of, damage to, and destruction of assets; errors and omissions; injuries to employees; and natural disasters. All significant losses are covered by commercial insurance. There has been no significant reduction in insurance coverage. Settlement amounts have not exceeded insurance coverage for the current year or the three prior years.

NOTE L - INTEREST COST INCURRED:

During the current year the Town incurred interest costs totaling 19,139.00 which was charged as an expense to various accounts.

NOTE M - OVERLAPPING DEBT:

The Town of Bristol is situated in Lincoln County and is therefore subject to annual assessment of its proportional share of county expenses. Long-term debt outstanding in Lincoln County for which the Town of Bristol would be proportionally responsible in the event the County defaulted, is approximately \$6,190,000.00 at December 31, 2015. The Town of Bristol's share would be 12.9% of the debt, or \$798,510.00.

NOTE N - EXPENDITURES IN EXCESS OF APPROPRIATIONS:

During the year there were overdrafts in Abatements, Marsh Island tax, and Homestead which historically have not been appropriated but rather are funded from unappropriated surplus.

NOTE O - JOINT VENTURE:

The Towns of Bristol and South Bristol have entered into an interlocal agreement to provide for solid waste disposal facilities for the two communities. The joint venture is administered by a joint board composed of the Board of Selectmen from each town. All costs and revenues are shared in the ratio of 60% - Bristol and 40% - South Bristol.

For the fiscal year ended December 31, 2015, the Town has elected to implement Statement No. 68 of the Governmental Accounting Standards Board – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, an amendment of GASB Statement No. 27. As a result of implementing GASB Statement No. 68, the Town has restated beginning net position in the government-wide statement of net position to account for the addition of the Town's proportionate share of the net pension liability of \$35,851.00 and deferred outflows for the Town's contributions subsequent to the measurement date of \$4,661.64, which effectively decreased the Town's net position as of January 1, 2014 by \$1,189.36.

Selectmen's Report

2015 was Bristol's 250th year as an organized town with a nice celebration at the annual Olde Bristol Days event, thanks to the effort of our organizing committee and other local organizations.

The fishing vessel "Columbia" has been moved from Pemaquid Harbor after a 2-year effort by the Harbor Committee. We want to thank Doug Wood from Bremen for securing ownership of the vessel and wish him the best in his effort to restore the vessel. We will continue to monitor the outcome of this effort.

The Town of Bristol remains in good financial condition, based on our annual audit. We have continued to maintain a healthy budget surplus which allows the town to operate throughout the calendar year without the need for tax anticipation borrowing. Collections on property taxes remain excellent, this contributes to the healthy budget surplus. Thanks go out to all our taxpayers for their diligence in paying their property taxes.

An error was made this year in calculating the mil rate, because we used the incorrect school budget figure. The excess tax dollars collected will be used to reduce the cost of operating the school for the next fiscal year.

Property values have continued to trend upward in 2015. The town's state valuation remains one of the largest in Lincoln County at approximately \$943,350,000. Our share of the Lincoln County budget was \$1,173,094.24.

Major road improvement projects were completed on the Poor Farm Road, Browns Cove Road and Old County Road. Maintenance paving was done on portions of the Lower and Upper Round Pond Roads, Southern Point Road and Split Rock Road. The projects on the Poor Farm Road and the Rock Schoolhouse Road complete the paving on these roads. We want to thank the residents for their patience while the projects were completed.

The Bristol Mills Dam was inspected this year to assess its condition prior to moving forward with the fish ladder replacement project. The dam is in good condition overall and we will begin the first phase of recommended maintenance in 2016. We plan to incorporate better water controls on the dam to more safely maintain water levels and have a formal water control plan.

We want to thank Heather Houston for her 13 years working in the town office and welcome Elizabeth Peters and Joe Rose to the town staff.

The 2015 edition of the Town Report is dedicated to the organizers of Olde Bristol Days and the Merritt Brackett Lobster Boat Races. Thank you for making Bristol's 250^{th} year such a special occasion.
