## Harbor Committee Bristol Town Hall October 25, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 6:03 pm.

## Minutes.

On a motion by Poland and seconded by Benner, the minutes from August 24 were approved unanimously.

## Round Pond.

The Coast Guard has contacted Doug Wood regarding the Columbia. They have deemed the bill of sale written from Sheehy to Wood as invalid. The Coast Guard has offered Wood assistance in disposal of the vessel and have required him to file an action plan for disposal. A possible solution is to sink it offshore to be used as an underwater diving site. The Coast Guard has requested a letter from the town absolving the town of any vested interest in the vessel.

The town's attorney has been notified and has agreed to compose such letter. Stolecki made a motion for the committee to review the letter by email and to have the committee sign at the Town Hall when ready. Poland seconded the motion. It was carried unanimously.

## Other Business.

- The most current Harbor & Landing budget was reviewed.
- Concerns about the Parks Commission spending were raised. Specifically related to the Harbor Committee recently being held responsible for maintenance costs at Hanna Landing. It was reiterated that a capital expenditure account would be started for maintenance at Hanna Landing. This account would be funded from taxation.
- What appeared to be an abandoned sailboat near Round Pond has been claimed. The sailboat was most likely subject of a domestic dispute.
- A local resident, Mark Zaccadelli, Jr., has started a marine construction business.
- Stolecki mentioned the cross bracing under the dock portion of Hanna Landing needs work.

Meeting adjourned at 6:48pm. The next tentative meeting will be held on January 25 @ 6 pm.
