Select Board's Report, Chairman Chad Hanna, Kristine Poland, Paul Yates

Bristol continues to hold a strong financial position. We have maintained a healthy budget surplus and expect it will be needed for the cost of repairing Long Cove Point Road and emergency clean-up of New Harbor after the January storms. We continue to hold the highest property valuation in Lincoln County and our collections on property taxes are excellent. Thank you to all taxpayers.

2023 was a relatively quiet year. After town meeting approval, we graciously accepted the gift of the Willing Workers Hall from the Bristol Area Lions Club. The building is in need of some repairs, but we are happy it remains in our community for public use. The building will be available for meetings, small gatherings, and music and dance events.

The long-awaited school renovation project is underway and completion by September 2024 is expected. A ground-breaking ceremony was held on June 13 and a child from each grade had the honor of marking the first day of construction with 'Blue Devil' shovels.

The comprehensive plan is in its final stages of completion. Next steps include final editing and a consistency review by the state. The Department of Agriculture, Conservation & Forestry review comprehensive plans for consistency with the goals and guidelines of Maine's Growth Management Act.

This year, preliminary work has been completed on several road and bridge projects. Engineering designs and permits are in place for the replacement of Hatchtown Bridge. Trees and brush were removed from the sides of Sodom Road, Split Rock Road, and Tukey Lane in preparation of widening the road, drainage, building up the roadbed, and eventually pavement. Our biggest road concern at this time is Long Cove Point Road. Almost half of the road was washed out in the January storms. As this goes to print, the road is being re-constructed and will be raised several inches and the sea barrier strengthened for protection against future weather events.

We thank the entire staff of the Town of Bristol for their commitment to doing their jobs well. We welcome you to our meetings held each month on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday at the Town Office. Please refer to the town's website for most up-to-date meeting information. www.bristolmaine.org.

THE COLLECTION OF TAXES

Assessments are based on the status of property as of April 1st of the tax year. Valuations can be adjusted at any time during April, or until the taxes have been committed to the Tax Collector. Upon commitment, the valuations become permanent record and may be changed only through the abatement process. Tax bills will be mailed to the owner of record as of April 1st, and if known to the Town a copy will be mailed to any new owner. It is interesting to note that in Maine, there is no legal requirement for the Town to provide a tax bill.

The tax due date and the interest rate for late payment are determined by vote of the townspeople at the Annual Town Meeting held in March of each year. In 2023, the Select Board recommended September 15th for the due date and 8% for the interest rate on late payments. 8% is the maximum allowable interest rate in 2023 as set by the State Treasurer. Prepayment of taxes in any amount, but not to exceed the previous year's amount, will be accepted at any time.

THE LIEN PROCESS

Between eight and twelve months after taxes have been committed, the Tax Collector will place a lien on any real estate account with an unpaid balance. All lien costs must be paid by the delinquent taxpayer before the lien can be discharged. If the lien remains unpaid for 18 months after having been recorded, the Town becomes the owner of the property. At this point the prior owner may negotiate with the Select Board to buy back the property, or the Town may sell the property at auction.

PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

Homestead Exemption

You are entitled to a Homestead Exemption if:

- You are a legal resident of Maine as of April 1st and have owned a homestead in the State of Maine for at least the past 12 months;
- You declare the homestead in Bristol is your permanent/primary residence;
- This is the only property for which you have claimed a homestead property tax exemption.

Veteran's Exemption

You are entitled to a Veteran's Exemption if you are a veteran, or the widow of one, who served active duty during a federally recognized war period and was discharged or retired under honorable conditions. The Veteran must have reached age 62 or must be receiving a pension or compensation from the United States Government for total disability, either service or non-service connected. Form DD 214 is required to be furnished with the application.

Blind Exemption

You are entitled to a Blind Exemption if you have been determined to be blind by a licensed Doctor of Medicine, Doctor of Osteopathy or Doctor of Optometry. Appropriate documentation is required to be furnished to prove eligibility.

If you are already receiving any of these exemptions, there is no need to reapply. Applications are available at the Town Office or on our website at *www.bristolmaine.org* and must be filed on or before April 1st of each year.

CURRENT LAND USE PROGRAMS

The State of Maine has four "current use" programs that offer the property owner a reduction in assessed value: Farmland, Open Space, Tree Growth, and Working Waterfront. The programs establish valuation of property at its current use, rather than at market value.

All four programs are available to property owners through an application process with the local municipality. Applications must be filed on or before April 1st of the year the reduced valuation is first requested.

Property must meet certain criteria to qualify for each program and any future change in the use of the land will cause disqualification resulting in a penalty.

FARMLAND

In the Farmland program, the property owner is required to have at least five contiguous acres in their parcel of land. The land must be used for farming, agriculture or horticulture and can include woodland and wasteland. Additionally, the parcel must contribute at least \$2,000 gross income from farming activities each year.

The Department of Agriculture prepares a valuation guideline for municipalities, which results from studies based on suggested values using a correlation from income stream and market data attributable to agricultural enterprise.

If the property no longer qualifies as farmland, then a penalty will be assessed. The penalty is equal to the taxes that would have been paid in the last five years if the property had not been in farmland, less the taxes that were paid, plus any interest on that balance.

See Bulletin 20 (Farmland Tax Law), 36 M.R.S. §§ 1101 – 1121 (Farm and Open Space Tax Law), and 7 M.R.S. chapter 2-B (Registration of Farmland) on the Maine Revenue Website.

OPEN SPACE

There is no minimum acreage requirement with this program. However, minimum areas and setbacks must be excluded from classification.

The parcel must be preserved or restricted in use to provide a public benefit. Benefits recognized include public recreation, scenic resources, game management, and wildlife habitat.

The municipal assessor is responsible for determining the value placed on open space land. In the determination of that value, the assessor must consider the sale price that a particular open space parcel would command in the open market if it were to remain in the particular category or categories of open space land for which it qualifies.

If an assessor is unable to determine the value of a parcel of open space land based on the valuation method above, the assessor may use the alternative valuation method. Using this method, the assessor reduces the fair market value of an open space land parcel by the cumulative percentage reduction for which the land is eliqible according to certain categories. Those categories are as follows:

Ordinary Open Space - 20% reduction

Permanently Protected - 30% reduction

Forever Wild - 20% reduction

Public Access - 25% reduction

In other words, if the property met all of the above requirements, the owner would see a cumulative reduction of up to 95% on the classified land.

If property no longer qualifies as open space, a penalty will be assessed using the same methodology as is used for removal from the Tree Growth program (see below).

TREE GROWTH

This program provides a benefit for owners of at least ten acres of forested land used for commercial harvesting. A forest management and harvest plan must be prepared and a sworn statement to that effect submitted with the application. Applications must include a map of the parcel indicating the forest type breakdown as well as all other areas to be excluded from the tree growth program.

Each year, the State Tax Assessor determines the valuation per acre for each forest type by county. For a list of current Tree Growth rates, see Rule 202 on the *Maine Revenue Website*.

Forestry Management Plans must be re-submitted every 10 years in order to remain classified in the Tree Growth program. If forest land no longer meets the criteria of eligibility or the landowner opts to withdraw from the tree growth program, a penalty will be assessed. Depending upon the length of time that the parcel has been enrolled, the penalty is between 20% and 30% of the difference between the 100% Tree Growth value and the fair market value of the land.

See Bulletin 19 (Maine Tree Growth Tax Law) and 36 M.R.S. §§ 571 – 584 (Tree Growth Tax Law) on the Maine Revenue Website.

WORKING WATERFRONT

"Working waterfront land" means a parcel or portion of a parcel of land abutting tidal waters or is located in the intertidal zone (located between the high and low water mark) the use of which is more than 50% related to providing access to or in support of the conduct of commercial fishing (including commercial aquaculture) activities.

Working waterfront land used predominantly (more than 90%) as working waterfront is eligible for a 20% reduction from just value. Working waterfront land used primarily (more than 50%) as working waterfront is eligible for a 10% reduction from just value. Working waterfront land that is permanently protected from a change in use through deeded restriction is eligible for an additional 30% reduction.

If property no longer qualifies as working waterfront, a penalty will be assessed using the same methodology as is used for removal from Tree Growth classification.

PERSONAL PROPERTY BUSINESS TAX RELIEF

RFTI

Certain businesses may qualify for an exemption on personal property tax for equipment first subject to tax on April 1, 2008. This is an annual application.

BETR

Certain Businesses may qualify for reimbursement on personal property tax paid during the previous year. Taxpayers begin the application process by filing Form 801 with our office.

Bristol Fire & Rescue, Scott Sutter Jr., Fire Chief

Bristol Fire & Rescue responded to 408 calls in 2023. We responded to 2 structure fires, 1 camper fire, 1 chimney fire, 293 EMS calls, 10 calls for power lines down, 22 calls for trees down, 2 searches for persons on land, 28 false alarms of varying origins, and several other miscellaneous calls for service. These calls accounted for 2,122-man hours from the members. Another 500 hours were spent on training, and another 843 hours on activities such as station maintenance, meetings, events, and other time spent at the stations.

Call volume can never be predicted. We have gone five days without calls, but then spent the next day on 5 different calls. There is no predictability. Some of these calls only had one or two people on them, while others had up to 13 people respond. I cannot thank the Bristol Fire & Rescue members enough for their dedicated time. This dedication of time takes a toll. Some members have taken a leave of absence for a period, and others have decided not to continue their time on the Fire Dept. This is understandable with the time for work, family, and everything else we are all busy with. But we have also welcomed 5 new members this year. The training needed to just show up and be able to do anything on a call is lengthy, and these citizens have stepped up to the task and are handling it well.

This year we received a grant to cover 96% of our new extrication tools. These new Hurst battery powered tools are much stronger and more maneuverable than our old hydraulic tools. These allow us to go wherever we need and cut through anything we encounter. We are no longer tethered to our truck by hoses. We have put these to use twice just a few weeks after putting them into service. This also allows us to put the tools on a different truck if our Heavy Rescue needs to go out of service for maintenance. Also, the Samoset Engine Company purchased a new light tower that is mounted on top of our Heavy Rescue. This light extends up 11 feet over the top of the cab, illuminating the scene within seconds of arrival making the scene much safer, and prevents cords from being run for smaller lights. Thank you very much. We are still in the process of specing out a replacement for Tank 1. With the changes happening so fast everywhere, we are looking at all options and sizes to ensure that the next truck will last just as long serving the community.

As always, please get your house number out next to the road. This is a very big help for us, and everyone to find your house. Keep the branches on your driveway cut back so the trucks can fit. Knox boxes are available to securely place a key to your house in that only the fire department has access to, so that in case of an emergency we can get in without causing damage to your house. Especially if you have a monitored alarm system.

Thank you to all for your continued support, and to the Fire & Rescue members for their dedication and tireless efforts in serving the community to the best of our abilities.

Bristol Parks & Recreation, Clyde Pendleton Sr., Chair, Sandra Lane, Laurie Mahan

The Bristol Parks and Recreation Department was looking forward to a great year in 2023. We were fully staffed going into summer at the Beach and the Lighthouse, and we were able to add new maintenance staff with a wide variety of skills. We also had a new Surf Rake which would remove the seaweed from the beach making it look even better than it normally would. With all of those additions, and the return of the Pemaquid Triathlon, 2023 looked like it was going to be a great season. With all of that to look forward to in 2023, of course there had to be challenges that popped up to test our resilience.

The theme for 2023 was weather. The year started in the spring with rebuilding the boardwalk after the big Christmas storm destroyed it. The entire ramp end of the boardwalk had been ripped off and ended up on the far end of the beach. The boardwalk ramp was completely rebuilt by our skilled maintenance staff once the snow melted in April. At the same time, we began work on a dune restoration project to repair the significant damage to the dunes from that same storm. The restoration was done by our Parks staff, with tractor and heavy lifting help from the Park Commissioners and Highway Department. The whole project was guided by a dune specialist with Maine Geological Survey and the DEP and was so successful it became part of a presentation to NOAA about new, innovative ways to work on restoring dunes.

The weather wasn't done with us just because we wanted to open for the season though. May was beautiful weather for the Lighthouse opening and we were hoping for continued good weather for the Beach opening in June. That didn't happen. Summer 2023 was the wettest summer on record since 1917 which is difficult when so much of the Parks and Recreation Department revenue is weather dependent for the 12 weeks of summer. Thankfully, the staff stayed with us through all of the cancelled shifts and the weather finally turned nice in mid-July so we could try to salvage the rest of the summer. Our staff stayed positive even when we didn't think it would ever stop raining or the fog would ever clear.

The revenue from renting beach umbrellas, chairs and boogie boards was about the same as 2022 even with a 5% drop in attendance. While rental revenue stayed flat, merchandise sales at the beach increased with the addition of new merchandise that was very popular. While the revenue at the Beach was down, the revenue at the Lighthouse was up with the increase in admission fee from \$3 per adult to \$4 and the increased attendance. The Lighthouse is not as weather dependent as the Beach, so the rainy early season did not affect the attendance for the season which ended about 10% higher than in 2022. Overall, revenue increased for the Parks and Recreation Department in 2023, aided in part by the restart of the annual Pemaquid Triathlon after a hiatus during the pandemic.

While we worked hard to cut expenses not knowing what the weather would do to our revenue, expenses did increase in 2023. There were several expensive regular repairs that were completed like roofing the Old Rock School House and siding the Bell Tower at the Lighthouse. There were also several emergency repairs having to be done within the department including rebuilding the Beach boardwalk and replacing a heating oil tank at the Lighthouse. Even with the increased expenses, the increased revenue allowed the Park Commission to put over \$100,000 in Capital Reserves bringing the total to \$392,372.08. About \$100,000 of this total has been dedicated to future projects such as a playground at the beach, new ADA compliant restroom building at the Lighthouse, and a new garage to store the tractor and seaweed machine that was purchased in 2023.

At the end of April, the maintenance staff moved to the Lighthouse to begin painting the inside of the Fishermen's Museum. As the summer was nearing, our maintenance staff received training on how to use the new Surf Rake seaweed machine we had purchased. We were very excited to see how it would work on our beach, especially when the seaweed was thick. The public consensus is the machine is amazing, and we at Parks and Recreation completely agree. Not only did it pick up the seaweed, it also picked up the small rocks, bottle caps, and other debris that was on the beach. By removing the seaweed off the beach each morning, it made the daily cleaning take much less time than previous years. The bonus was the fresh corduroy on the sand every morning which the ski and snowboard fans will understand, but that everyone appreciated. As the year was coming to an end, we were able to get the Rock School House re-shingled and have new siding put on the Bell Tower and both look great. We will do work on the ceiling inside the Rock School House in 2024 and hope to be able to open it again when it is completed.

Recreational programming in 2023 continued to be offered on a limited basis. We hosted the annual boys and girls basketball clinic which was held leading into the school basketball season. It was a full program, and everyone had fun and learned a lot; look for additional youth programming coming in 2024. The Parks Department is open to suggestions for programming ideas for the youth in the community. During the summer months, Yoga and Tai Chi continued to be offered on the beach and a Meditation program was offered in Lighthouse Park. These programs allowed for participation from a wide range of age groups, and they were very well-received by the community and will continue in 2024.

Community service continued to be a big focus for Bristol Parks. Bristol Parks Passes are still offered at no charge to Bristol residents and taxpayers. This was very appreciated by residents and will be offered again in 2024! A summer concert series was held at Pemaquid Beach that was very successful, including the annual Bath Band concert. Olde Bristol Days continued at the Beach in 2023 with games and activities for children, vendors, food, music, and of course an amazing firework display to end the night. We look forward to having Olde Bristol Days at the Beach again in 2024.

As was said at the beginning of this, the theme for 2023 was weather. We fought the weather as we were getting ready for the season, and we fought the weather as we went through the early season. The weather wasn't done with us though as we closed the year with massive storms that caused absolute devastation to our town, but also to our beloved Pemaquid Lighthouse Park and Pemaquid Beach. The Bell Tower building will have to be almost completely rebuilt after losing 2 walls, but the bell, a Henry Hooper bell from 1848, was safe as it had been taken down in August due to beam instability. The dunes at the Beach will be an even bigger restoration project going into 2024, and the boardwalk has to be rebuilt again. Through all of that, we know everyone in town will be there when we need them to help us just as they have been there for us every time we have asked. For that, we as the Parks Commissioners and Parks and Recreation Department Staff truly appreciate all of you.

In closing, 2023 had many challenges for the Parks and Recreation Department. What made the year successful was the staff. We may be biased, but we believe we had the best staff anyone could ask for at the Lighthouse and Beach in 2023, and we look forward to most of them returning for 2024. When you see the Beach looking beautiful and clean, and the Lighthouse set up for a nice wedding, thank those staff members because none of it could be done without them. After the challenges of 2023, we know as a department that we will overcome these new challenges and the parks will be beautiful and ready for opening day.

Code Enforcement Office, Joe Rose

The Code Enforcement Office has seen the number of permits remain steady for 2023 which include 23 new single-family dwellings, up 2 from 2022.

New for 2024 is LD-2003, the affordable Housing Act which will take effect in July. The Planning Board and Code Office is currently working with a consultant to amend the Bristol Land Use and Subdivision Ordinances to reflect the changes required by the law. It is expected that the changes that will apply to Bristol will allow for more than one Accessory Dwelling Units, sometimes referred to as in-law apartments, even on non-conforming lots. Each property must meet the Maine State Subsurface Wastewater Disposal rules to accommodate the number of dwellings and bedrooms on a property, as well as all current setback requirements. All restrictions of the Shoreland Zone Ordinance will also apply.

Fish Committee, Jay Crooker, Chair

The fish ladder and surrounding area looked similar to how it did in 2022. There was a delay in masonry work to place stone caps along the length of the ladder, but it is expected that this work will commence in the spring of 2024. Temporary fencing was again erected to prevent visitors from entering the erosion-prone and hazardous area on the inside (western side) of the ladder. This year, the fencing was placed on the inside (western) edge of the ladder (rather than the outer edge), allowing visitor access to the tops of the pools. This facilitated easier viewing of the alewives as they gathered in the resting pools and climbed the ladder.

On May 1st, record-breaking rainfall (over 6 inches) occurred overnight, resulting in usually high-water levels at the dam. Water was observed flowing over the top of the platform of the dam, and around the cement barrier at the top of the fish ladder. Water flowing along the outer edge of the ladder caused erosion which was repaired the following day. While no structural damage to the ladder occurred, plans have been made for expanding the cement barrier to accommodate high water levels that may occur in future flooding events.

Fish counts were conducted for the 11th consecutive year. An estimated total of 277,000 alewives passed through the fishway and headed up the Pemaquid River toward spawning grounds at Biscay and Pemaquid Ponds. The counts were conducted by a team of 36 volunteers for 43 consecutive days (May 11 to June 23). Counts were again taken in 15-minute intervals in two-hour time blocks from sunrise to sunset, and the counting data entered and analyzed in software provided by the Maine Department of Marine Resources (DMR).

The fish count this year was lower than in 2022 (352,000), but this was expected due to several factors. The primary reason was that alewife runs are cyclical, alewife fry return to their spawning grounds four years after they are born. Since the run in 2018 was unusually small, we anticipated a smaller total run due to fewer returning 4-year-old alewives. Other contributing factors were the cooler temperatures and unusually high water levels, both of which typically hinder alewife migration.

Scale samples from the alewives were also collected on several days during the run, to monitor the age and sex of migrating alewives. These samples, along with fish counts, are submitted yearly to the Maine DMR. As the alewife runs build each year, a sustainable run should be achieved that could get approval for a harvest permit from the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission. Scale samples submitted in 2022 were not yet analyzed by DMR biologists, so we expect to receive interesting results in the spring of 2024 when the samples collected in 2022 and 2023 are analyzed.

Comprehensive Plan Committee, *Jessica Yates*, *Richard Francis*, *Co-Chairs*

As of the date of this Town Report, Bristol's Comprehensive Plan Committee is in the final stages of its work to develop and present a Comprehensive Plan to the Town's voters for their consideration. The current draft of Bristol's Comprehensive Plan is based on the Committee's two and a half year effort to analyze data, think strategically, and listen to the Town's residents. As a result of this work, the Plan's priorities reflect the residents' passion for Bristol's small town atmosphere, people, and natural beauty, and their desire to "keep Bristol the way it is." These priorities include preserving the Town's rural character, protecting natural and marine resources, maintaining an affordable tax rate, providing access to affordable housing, and understanding the impacts of climate change on the Town.

The Plan has two sections. The first section contains the Town's vision and priorities, and a Future Land Use Plan, while the second contains required inventory chapters, a regional coordination program, public participation, and survey results, as well as the Plan's goals, policies, and suggested strategies.

In October 2023, the second draft of the Plan was completed, and reviewed by the Chair of the Select Board and members of the Planning Board. Subsequently, a well-attended Public Hearing was held on December 7, 2023, at which time some members of the community provided additional feedback regarding the content and formatting of the Plan. The Committee worked to incorporate the additional edits to the Plan while awaiting a joint meeting with the Select Board and Planning Board scheduled for late February 2024.

Upon approval from the Chair of the Select Board and the Co-Chairs of the Committee, the Committee will then submit the Plan to the State for review and consideration of consistency with the technical requirements of the State's Growth Management Act. After the State deems the Plan consistent, the Town will then be provided with another opportunity to review the Plan and will ultimately decide whether or not to adopt the Plan by vote at a future town meeting.

Adopting a Comprehensive Plan enables the Town to manage future development, enforce ordinances and to compete for funding from the State and donors. However, it is important to know that a Town's adoption of a Comprehensive Plan does not result in the automatic implementation of the suggestions in the Plan. An adopted Plan is a valuable tool for the Town's leaders to use when planning for the future, but it is not a mandate. Some things in the Plan will move forward, and some things won't; elected Boards, Committees, and voters will be the ones who decide.

The Comprehensive Plan Committee encourages residents to stay informed about, and involved in, the next steps of this process. More information, including the current draft of the Comprehensive Plan, is available on the Town's website at: www.bristolmaine.org/comprehensive-plan-committee.

Bristol Education Report, Lynsey Johnston, Superintendent of AOS 93 Schools; Tara McKechnie, Asst. Superintendent; Jennifer Ribeiro, Principal Bristol Consolidated School

The Central Lincoln County School System (CLCSS), operating as an Alternative Organizational Structure (AOS 93) serves seven towns: Bremen, Bristol, Damariscotta, Jefferson, Newcastle, Nobleboro, and South Bristol. AOS 93 brings together eight smaller school districts under the umbrella of AOS #93, which provides Central Office services. We encompass five elementary schools: Bristol Consolidated, Jefferson Village, Nobleboro Central, South Bristol and Great Salt Bay, and are responsible for all secondary students as well. Approximately 1020 students attend PreK to eighth grade in their communities' own school district within AOS 93. AOS 93 does not operate a high school; each AOS 93 town pays the approved state tuition rate to a local public or private high school. Through their high school, students have the opportunity to attend vocational programming, mainly at Bath Area Tech Center, Capital Area Tech Center, or Midcoast Tech Center. Most of our students attend school locally and a small percentage attend schools with boarding options. To receive these public funds schools must meet criteria for instruction and complete an approval process with the State of Maine. During the 2023-2024 school year there were approximately 540 students attending area public high schools, private academies, or equivalency programs.

AOS 93 is guided by a mission statement with the common purpose of providing high quality learning for all CLCSS students. This system creates a network to implement a common curriculum, assessment and instruction aligned with important learning standards that support all students achieving a high level during the school years. During the summer, intervention efforts for our students who have lost learning during the pandemic continue with a full-day summer school program. Each school partners with CLC YMCA and Coastal Rivers Conservation Trust to provide students with targeted academics as well as outdoor, experiential learning opportunities.

The vibrancy of our local communities and their support for our AOS 93 schools is essential for the attainment of student aspirations. Our common mission of providing high quality learning for all AOS 93 students continues. Together we make a positive difference in the lives of our students, local families, and the communities in which we live and work.

Bristol Consolidated School is serving 192 students in grades PreK-8 as of December 31, 2023. In addition to these PK-8 students, Bristol has nearly 90 high school students. Most of these students attend Lincoln Academy, our nearest high school of choice. Several students are participating in homeschooling or other options including Maine School of Science and Math, Maine Academy of Natural Science, or Maine Connections Academy. We have 6 students currently working on high school completion through CLC Adult Education. In the last fiscal year 68 lifelong learning students have been served through CLC Adult Education's enrichment classes. Bristol's focus continues to be providing the highest quality

educational experience to meet the diverse needs of our students. This is evident in each classroom where teachers and staff work tirelessly to meet the academic and social-emotional needs of our students. We provide instruction that inspires students to make growth on academic standards across the various curriculum areas. Focusing on progress with standards ensures that all students are challenged appropriately throughout their school experience. We are committed to engaging students in a curriculum that is focused on stewardship of our marine environment. Our goal is to instill an appreciation for the natural world around us. Teaching our students about the ecology and natural history of our peninsula will prepare them to face the challenges presented to their community over the next generations and inspire them with a sense of belonging to this special place. Partnerships with FARMS at the YMCA, Coastal Rivers Conservation Trust, Kieve, and the Darling Marine Center are in place and provide our students with rich learning experiences.

Lincoln Academy, Jeffrey S. Burroughs, Head of School

Thank you for your continuing support of Lincoln Academy, an independent school serving students from midcoast towns since our founding in 1801. The school is thriving thanks to our supportive community, vibrant and diverse student body, and hardworking faculty and staff.

Lincoln Academy "By the numbers"

- 25% of LA students qualified for free & reduced lunch (underreported since lunch is free for everyone)
- 20% of juniors and seniors attend vocational programming at BRCTC
- 18% of LA students take one or more AP classes during their years at LA
- 54% of LA students play at least one sport
- 23% participate in band, choir, and/or theater programs

2023-24 Facilities Upgrades:

- LA's historic bell tower is scheduled for structural repairs. The bell itself is currently being refurbished by Elderhorst Bell Company in Pennsylvania. The belfry and tower will be shored up, starting with the foundation, before we return the bell to its traditional perch.
- In the summer of 2024, we will replace the light poles on the William Clark field. The new lights will be more energy efficient and throw off less light pollution during night games, and a new sound system will be integrated into the new poles.

Enrollment: 564 Students from 21 Towns and 13 Countries

Enrollment numbers have been positive, with our current ninth grade class size exceeding last year's predictions. Next year's incoming class (the class of 2028) is expected to be very close in number to the graduating Class of 2024, and we anticipate total day student enrollment to remain consistent next year. The residential program continues to grow, and we expect to have over 40 international and domestic students in the dorm next year.

Academics:

Lincoln Academy offers 135 classes, including over 40 STEM classes, more than 30 Performing and Visual Arts classes, 33 Advanced Placement (AP) and honors classes, and 11 vocational certificate programs through the Bath Regional Career and Technical Center (BRCTC).

Athletics:

In 2023 LA sports teams won conference championships in both boys and girls tennis, girls track, boys soccer, and both boys and girls cross country. We had seven KVAC Coach of the year awards, three Good Sportsmanship awards, and school records broken in track and field. Individual athletes won KVAC championships in wrestling, swimming, track and field, and cross country. Roan Donaghy '25 of Damariscotta won the Class B State Championship in Racewalk, and Kellen Adickes '25 of Bristol won the New England Golf Championship.

Performing Arts:

The theater program staged seven sold-out performances of The Crucible in the fall of 2023. 13 musicians (including band, choir, jazz, and orchestra) qualified for All-State music festivals, while 45 qualified for District III Honors music festival. Of the 149 graduates in the class of 2023:

- 74 enrolled in 4-year colleges
- 39 enrolled in 2-year colleges
- 34 entered the workforce
- 2 entered the military

One member of the class was a National Merit Semifinalists and 44 were AP Scholars. Graduates were awarded over \$350,000 in scholarships through Lincoln Academy, local, statewide, and national foundations.

Faculty Credentials

- 57% of Lincoln Academy faculty have their master's or other advanced degree
- 4 faculty members have gone beyond state certification to become Nationally Teacher Certified Teachers

Career Preparation

- The Second Annual Peter J. Benner Job Fair hosted 30 local businesses with immediate openings for employment. Some students were hired on the spot! The third annual Job Fair is planned for April 3, 2024.
- A weekly Career Exploration Series is currently underway, bringing professionals to campus to meet with students and discuss a wide variety of career paths.
- The online Jobs Board connected dozens of students and recent graduates with summer and year-round jobs at local businesses and organizations.

Central Lincoln County Adult & Community Education is thankful for the support shown by its communities over the past four decades. There have been many changes to the charge of adult education since the 2014 passing of the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), the greatest of these being a focus on preparing adults for the workforce. While high school completion (formerly the GED program, now HiSET) continues to be a focus, the state and federal governments as well as local demand have created the need to go beyond a focus on high school to post-secondary certifications, workforce preparation, and college and career advising. We assist students well beyond their high school graduation and have adults continue to return as their lives and goals change. In addition, we create opportunities for community members to engage in the school community through life-enriching activities. We hope you will continue to support and join us on our journey.

Central Lincoln County Adult & Community Education (CLCAE) is part of the Maine Department of Education's MidCoast Hub 7 collaborative that includes 9 programs spread across the 4 midcoast counties from Sagadahoc north through Waldo. Each of the nine programs relies on a combination of money from the state (State Subsidy), local taxes (the Local Contribution), and our primary grants AEFLA (the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act federal grant) and MCCA (the Maine College and Career Access state grant).

Adult and Community Education Local Enrollment

In terms of students served, CLCAE has a wonderful reputation throughout the midcoast for helping students succeed where they have yet to be successful in their local high school due to a variety of reasons. We continue to see a need for increased services. The COVID-19 pandemic may be over, but the effects on teenage students are now being felt. 2023 represented the first year of completing high school students who did not have a single year of 'normal' school attendance.

For FY23, there were 9 student enrollments in academic programs from Bristol. This represents just over 13% of the enrollments within the AOS. There were an additional 68 enrollments in enrichment classes, representing 18%. Bristol's current allocation to education is 18.2%.

We see student enrollments increasing in college and career advising, with many working with us to help determine the best pathways based on career values and interests and the availability of funding in support of further education. Traditional CNA classes have become "hybrid" with part of the class taught live via Zoom and clinicals on-site at hospitals throughout the entire midcoast region. Meetings with career navigators happen both virtually and onsite at our office. Nearly all students spend a portion of their classes accessing materials through online learning management systems. Technology use has increased significantly, and all of the adults in our communities have FREE access to learning about Microsoft products, computer basics, and online security. We will continue to adapt as needed to enable the adults in our communities to succeed and improve opportunities for their families.

United States Senate

U.S. Senator, Susan M. Collins

It is an honor to serve the people of Maine in the U.S. Senate, and I welcome this opportunity to share an update on issues important to Maine and America.

One of my priorities for 2023 has been to improve the appropriations process in Congress - the way it decides how to spend taxpayer money. I took over as the Vice Chair of the Senate Appropriations Committee last year. Along with Chair Patty Murray, we decided the best change we could make was not to do something new. Instead, it was to do something old - that is, go back to the regular and transparent committee process that we used to have.

Part of restoring this process included holding 50 public Committee hearings, which allowed for input from senators on both sides of the aisle. As a result, for the first time in five years, the Senate Appropriations Committee passed all twelve of its funding bills on time. This was done with strong bipartisan support. In fact, seven of them passed unanimously.

Now, we need to work with the House of Representatives to pass these twelve bills and turn them into laws.

These bills contain funding for a wide range of Maine priorities, including support for the workforce at Bath Iron Works and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, our lobster industry, infrastructure improvements, affordable housing, biomedical research, veterans, and heating assistance programs like LIHEAP. These bills also contain nearly \$590 million in Congressionally Directed Spending for 231 projects throughout the State of Maine. These projects would help promote job creation, expand access to health care, and improve public safety, infrastructure, and important resources in communities across all 16 counties of our state. I will continue to work to get these bills signed into law in the new year.

On October 25, the horrific mass shooting in Lewiston claimed the lives of 18 Mainers and injured 13 others. In response, I led Maine's Congressional Delegation in requesting an independent investigation by the U.S. Army Inspector General into the events leading up to the shooting. On December 15, the Under Secretary of the Army wrote to inform me that such an investigation will take place, and the Army Inspector General has instructed her team to immediately begin preparing to conduct this investigation. While nothing can undo the events of October 25, I will continue to work to understand what happened and what could have been done differently, and to find answers for the victims, survivors, and their families.

No one works harder than the people of Maine, and this year I honored that work ethic when I cast my 8,855th consecutive roll call vote.

As we look ahead to 2024, I remain committed to addressing the concerns of Maine families and communities. If you need assistance or wish to share your thoughts, please do not hesitate to reach out to one of my six state offices.

I am thankful for each town in Maine for their commitment to their communities, to their citizens, and to this country. I will do my part to listen to your concerns and work to find useful solutions to the issues you face. My offices throughout Maine remain available to you if you face hurdles with the federal government, whether it be veteran issues, social security problems, student loans, immigration, tax assistance and more. In January, I was privileged to take the Oath of Office to begin my second term as your Governor. I am deeply humbled by the trust the people of Maine have placed in me, and I look forward to continuing to work hard over the next four years to improve the lives and livelihoods of Maine people.

Over the past four years, we have made real progress. We have expanded health care, leading to the largest decline in the uninsured rate of any state in the nation. Maine State Representative, Lydia Crafts, District 90

It continues to be an honor to serve you in the Maine House of Representatives. When you elected me to the State House, I promised to work to address our state's most pressing challenges head on – and that's exactly what we did in 2023.

We passed legislation that will make transformational investments to improve the lives of Maine people, make it easier for more folks to make ends meet and help create communities where all Mainers can thrive, including right here in Bristol.

The Legislature invested in the well-being of Maine workers and families by establishing a comprehensive paid family and medical leave program, increasing funding for Pre-K and childcare support and taking significant steps to address Maine's shortage of affordable and available housing, which is affecting our entire state. Additionally, several bills that I sponsored are now law, including a pilot program to provide transportation services to medically managed withdrawal sites for individuals to receive detoxification services. This legislation removes barriers to recovery and gives those on their path to sobriety access to the resources they need. As of this writing, we are one month into the second regular session of the 131st Legislature. Over the next few months, we will consider hundreds of bills before we adjourn, which will likely be in mid-April. This session, I am proud to serve as the House chair of the Transportation Committee, where we will continue to invest in repairing and adding to state roads, maintaining, and replacing bridges, clearing roads of snow and ice and managing stormwater through culvert replacement.

Lincoln County Sheriff's Office, Todd B. Brackett, Sheriff

As I begin my twenty-second year, I want to thank you once again for the opportunity to serve as the Lincoln County Sheriff. During my time in office, I have been privileged to find myself surrounded by men and women working hard every day to provide the best possible public safety services for each of you.

During the past several years some of my toughest challenges have been staffing during a period when greater accountability and transparency have been expected, while the interest in those seeking a career in public safety seems to have diminished.

Despite these challenges, I have worked hard with our County Commissioners to develop policies and practices to attract and retain employees to Lincoln County. I did this while being the first Sheriff in Maine to begin a Citizens Advisory Board with a goal of improving our transparency and providing valuable insight and opinions as we work to improve policy during a law enforcement accreditation process.

I am happy to report that I expect that in early 2024 the staffing level at the Sheriff's Office will have reached a point that will allow us to be more proactive with the public safety we provide without adding any additional positions to the budget.

Planning has begun to put in place a Deputy to provide dedicated traffic enforcement in areas of high crash and complaints. Traffic complaints are one of the most common concerns I hear in the community. I hope by assigning a Deputy to this position we can improve traffic safety and better respond to the concerns I have been hearing for many years.

Additionally, I hope to assign another Deputy to a position of Community Resource Deputy. This Deputy's primary focus will be building relationships with those vulnerable populations in Lincoln County that are at high risk or often subject to crime. I anticipate that by building relationships with these vulnerable populations (elderly, children, mentally ill, substance use disorder, domestic violence etc.) the Deputy can begin working on strategies to reduce crime and make our County a safer place to live.

I look forward to serving you again in 2024 and once again want to thank you for the opportunity to serve as your Sheriff.

Bristol Area Library, Jacqueline Bennett, Librarian

Computer use and technology continues to be an important service to our patrons; as is our wireless capability, which we receive through a fiber optics connection. This year we received \$2000 from a grant donated by the Coastal Maine Regional Broadband, which partnered with the Maine Connectivity Authority. We bought two new computers with charging stations for public use. We also bought a laptop which complements our previously purchased iPad. Both devices are equipped with Zoom capabilities.

In 2023 we were joined by 68 new library members, giving us a present total of 1,356. We recorded 8,993 adult visitors and 842 children and many visited for reasons not requiring membership. We offer free access to computers and wireless technology, we have a free magazine table, monthly art displays by local artists, a local genealogy room, access to Ancestry.com library edition, puzzles free for the taking, and knitting for all ages. The library is also a drop-off for the local food pantry and a meeting space for local organizations.

We had five author visits over the summer for adults and we offered year-round storytimes for preschoolers. An All Together Now summer reading program was enjoyed by two dozen children, and we ended the summer with a pet show. With a grant from the Maine Humanities Council, we were able to offer a book group about exploring community through Maine authors.

We are very proud of our collection of 28,984 items which you can search at *bal. tidewater.net*. We lend music CDs, movies, audio books, and have access to 15,020 downloadable books. Adults signed out 6,944 books and items. Children signed out 1,417 books and other materials. Movies were borrowed 737 times, and 856 ebooks and audio books were borrowed through CloudLibrary. Compliments of the Plein Air Painters, we were able to provide passes to the Farnsworth Museum and they were borrowed over 60 times. We receive free interlibrary loan service and in 2023 we borrowed 504 items.

This year's Board of Trustees includes Carol Jaeger, President; Judith Hope, Vice President; Sue Trouwborst, Recording Secretary; Bonnie Sablinsky, Treasurer; and Anne Merrill, Corresponding Secretary. Other trustees are Darin Carlucci, Becky Cooper, Judith Cotton, Wendy Harding, Andrea Powell, Kathleen Riess, Laura Sproul Stubbs, and Bruce Swift. Many thanks to retiring board members Andrew Fenniman and Kipp Johnson. Fund-raising is an imperative part of the library's income. *The Bristol Book Ends* continues to be financially beneficial, and the board is exploring and considering fresh ideas for 2024, while continuing with some of our traditional fund-raising events.

Finally, a thank you to our loyal patrons, to our 36 hard-working volunteers with 1,866 hours of service, to those who gave so generously to our annual appeal, and to the Friends of the Bristol Area Library for supporting children's programs and for funding our annual appeal and newsletter. Also, many thanks to the town of Bristol for their support of \$14,500 in appropriations which is a crucial part of our operating budget.

Central Lincoln County Ambulance Service,

Nicholas Bryant, Service Chief

The Central Lincoln County Ambulance Service responded to 2,308 calls in 2023, with 1594 being emergency calls for service. I am incredibly proud of the dedicated EMS providers at CLC Ambulances and the Bristol First Responders. They all continue to provide compassionate and quality medical care while displaying admirable dedication as they keep up with the increasing educational requirements to maintain their EMS licenses beyond the hours they work or are on call.

CLC Ambulance has continued to utilize grant opportunities to help acquire essential equipment without burdening the taxpayer. Through a successful grant process, we have funded our next ambulance replacement, due to be delivered in 2026. With the continued manufacturing delays in recent years, we still await delivery of an ambulance ordered in August of 2021. It is possible the unit funded by this grant will be delayed beyond 2026. We currently have 4 ambulances that have tens of thousands of miles put on each of them every year. Acquiring funding to order our units several years in advance of the needed delivery ensures that our fleet remains reliable to better serve our communities.

We have also continued to provide Community Paramedicine visits to members of our community for our ninth straight year. This program provides services to patients in their homes that include, at-home blood draws, medical assessments, wound care, medication reconciliation, education, and some point-of-care lab tests. The program runs through a referral from your primary care physician or a physician you may see in the Miles ER. The program has positively impacted many patients' ability to manage medical conditions at home. Please contact your primary care physician for more information if you or someone you know may benefit from these services.

The workforce within Emergency Medical Services has been shrinking over the last several years. There are several ways an EMS provider can serve their community whether it be full-time, part-time, or volunteer. If you are interested in helping your community and becoming an EMT, Paramedic, or First Responder, please contact our organization, or your local fire department. I want to thank Fire Chief Scott Sutter, EMS Chief Jeri Pendleton, and all the members of the Bristol Fire Department and First Responders for being essential partners in our effort to supply quality Emergency Medical Service to the Town of Bristol. We look forward to working alongside Bristol Fire and First Responders members to provide emergency care to the residents of Bristol again in 2024.

Community Housing Improvement Project

(CHIP, Inc.), Brittany Gill, Project Manager

"Neighbors helping neighbors keep their homes safe, warm, and dry."

When a family's wood supply was flooded during the December 18, 2023 storm, the household had no other way to heat their home. A call was made to CHIP and soon volunteers were on their way with a delivery of replacement firewood. Other Bristol and regional residents have requested help because their firewood supply fell short during an extended power outage or because the household income is not quite enough for basics, including food and fuel.

Thanks to steadfast volunteers, including Wood Chippers who cut, split and deliver, locals who have donated wood, the Lincoln Academy Student Stackers, and the transfer station committee, a cache of firewood is now neatly stacked at the Bristol-South Bristol Transfer Station. A second pile is drying in Jefferson.

Providing firewood is part of CHIP's larger fuel relief program, which offers up to 100 Gallons of fuel, 1 cord of wood, or electrical bill relief depending on a household's needs. The program runs November to March, primarily as a supplement to the federally funded LI-HEAP. We serve low-income households or those struggling to meet their basic fuel needs because of exceptional circumstances.

CHIP also offers a wide variety of essential home repairs to low-income households, so people can stay safe, warm, and dry in their own homes. While we provide services at no cost to the homeowner, CHIP welcomes contributions of materials or labor, as the homeowner is able. During the 2022-2023 fiscal year, CHIP made repairs to seven households and donated fuel to 26 residences throughout Bristol. Requests often come from seniors living alone on a limited income, families with young children experiencing underemployment, and individuals with disabilities that are limited in their capacity to make or afford repairs themselves.

Volunteers play a big role in CHIP's efforts to make homes safe, warm, and dry. Again, this year, over 100 volunteers, including Bristol residents, shared their time and skills on our annual Community Cares Day in September. Lincoln Academy students made window inserts. Other volunteers share their skills year-round. A group of youth from Basking Ridge, NJ comes up in the summer to do local service projects, too.

When the cellar door was shoved in and wouldn't shut properly to keep out the cold air anymore, a Bristol resident bought a new door. Unable to install it himself and concerned about meeting the cost of a carpenter on his limited income, this resident asked if CHIP might be able to help install it. Volunteers showed up and made a difference for our neighbor. CHIP works to connect people needing a hand with those able to give one. As we like to say, "neighbors helping neighbors."

CHIP, Inc (CHIP) is a 501(c)3 non-profit founded by Ruth Ives in 1984 as an ecumenical effort to keep people safe, warm and dry in their own homes. Currently, CHIP serves eleven towns in Central and Eastern Lincoln County, including Bristol.

Coastal Rivers Conservation Trust

Coastal Rivers Conservation Trust is your community land trust, caring for the lands and waters of the Damariscotta-Pemaquid region. Coastal Rivers has active programs in **trails and public access, land conservation, water quality,** and nature education.

For the benefit of all Bristol residents, in 2023 we provided:

Public access to trails, natural areas, and shorefront on Coastal Rivers' many
nature preserves in the greater Damariscotta-Pemaquid region. We maintain
over 50 miles of hiking trails for low impact use, free of charge, including
the universally accessible Rhoda and Lee Cohen River Trail in Damariscotta.
Preserves with hiking trails in Bristol include Bass Rock, Bearce Allen and
NORGAL, Cosima's, Crooked Farm, Hatchtown, Keyes Woods, La Verna,
and John and Peg Sproul.

Significant trail work took place this year at the popular La Verna Preserve and at Crooked Farm. One hundred feet of bog bridging was added at La Verna, and two short sections of trail were rerouted to avoid wet areas. One hundred fifty feet of bog bridging was added at Crooked Farm.

Coastal Rivers also partners with the Town of Bristol to maintain the Bristol Recreational Trail next to Bristol Consolidated School.

Studies show that spending time in nature can reduce stress, lower blood pressure, and boost energy and mood, among other benefits. We invite you to find trails to explore at *coastalrivers.org*.

• Land conservation and stewardship. Coastal Rivers holds title to 20 properties in Bristol, including one island, all open to the public for low impact recreation and enjoyment of the natural world. In addition to opportunities for recreation, these conservation lands serve to keep wildlife habitat intact, protect water quality, and help mitigate the effects of a changing climate. We also monitor 17 voluntary landowner conservation agreements on private land.

Coastal Rivers purchased two properties and received the donation of a voluntary conservation restriction (also called a conservation easement) on a third property in Bristol this past year. All three build on the **Half Moon Pond Conservation Area** off of Poor Farm Road. This undeveloped area of connected forest and wetlands – now expanded to nearly 1000 acres – protects water resources and offers excellent wildlife habitat as well as exciting opportunities for recreation.

Coastal Rivers has been monitoring the spread of the **invasive Hemlock Woolly Adelgid (HWA) insect** that is threatening the health of hemlock trees in our area. We continue working with a state entomologist to acquire batches of extensively tested predatory beetles that will reproduce and help control populations of HWA. Twenty additional colonies were released in the Half Moon Pond Conservation Area in 2023 in an effort to protect our local hemlock populations. These trees play an outsized role in shading and protecting water quality in streams and rivers, important for sensitive species such as brook trout.

- Continued support to Old Bristol Historical Society with the Mill at Pemaquid Falls. In 2020 ownership of the historic property was officially transferred to OBHS. Coastal Rivers continues to partner with OBHS, working with the Grounds Committee to ensure public access and protect water quality at the mouth of the Pemaquid River.
- Partnership with the Bristol Department of Parks and Recreation to host the Pemaquid Beach Triathlon in August, which raised over \$13,800 for the Pemaquid Beach Park playground fund.
- Water stewardship. Coastal Rivers water quality initiatives have two main goals: protecting water quality and preventing the introduction of invasive aquatic plants. Programs include:
 - o **Swim beach monitoring.** Water samples were taken weekly at Pemaquid Beach all summer long to check for bacterial contamination as part of the Maine Healthy Beaches Program. In 2023 the weekly water quality numbers were extremely good, with no safety alerts issued.

- o **Estuary water quality monitoring,** at seven points along the Damariscotta River estuary, from Walpole to Great Salt Bay. Twice a month from May through October, volunteers test for transparency, dissolved oxygen, salinity, temperature, and total nitrogen. These data help us understand changes in water quality and habitat conditions over time.
- o The Courtesy Boat Inspection (CBI) program at the Pemaquid Pond boat landing and Invasive Plant Patrol, both of which seek to keep aquatic invasive plants out of our lakes and ponds. Invasive plants can have a devastating impact on water quality, recreation, and property values. As part of the CBI program, friendly interns talked to Pemaquid Pond boaters about invasive plants and, with permission, looked over boats and trailers for any sign of invasive plants before they were launched. CBI is the first line of protection from invasive aquatic plants for the entire Pemaquid River system and its beautiful ponds. No aquatic invasive plants were found in the Pemaquid River or its lakes and ponds in 2023.
- o **The LakeSmart Program**, which offers free, individualized technical advice and information to lake and pond-side homeowners about best property care and management practices to prevent erosion and safeguard water quality. To learn more or to take advantage of this service, please contact Sarah Gladu at *sgladu@coastalrivers.org*.
- o **Information and resources.** These include water quality resources for waterfront homeowners, boating and fishing regulations, boating safety materials, lead tackle exchange, and loon habitat information.
- o In collaboration with Maine Audubon's Loon Count, volunteers participated in the annual loon count on all our local fresh-water ponds and lakes. Coastal Rivers hosted the volunteer breakfast at which the data sheets were collected and volunteers shared stories of sightings and observations about local loons.
- Coastal Rivers nature education programs that connect people of all ages with nature. In 2023 we provided over 10,000 student-hours of programming to people of all ages, from pre-K on up.
 - In summer 2023, for the first time, we worked with AOS 93 schools to offer four weekly full-day field trips for summer school students. The group visited local parks and trails to learn about different habitats, and the plants and animals that live there, through hands-on learning.
 - In October, all third-graders from Bristol Consolidated School (BCS) attended Coastal Rivers' Wabanaki Program at Salt Bay Farm with Passamaquoddy educator Sandra Bassett. Students worked on wigwams, learned a Wabanaki dance, and tasted wild edibles such as groundnuts.
 - With the exception of the summer school program, which was funded through a grant, all teacher support and outdoor education programs are free of charge to AOS 93 schools.

Throughout the year, for people of all ages, we offer in-person guided hikes and family programs that are open to the public and free of charge. We also host free online workshops, trainings, and discussions on a variety of topics. Find our calendar of events and programs at *coastalrivers.org/events*. • Beachcombers' Discovery Center (BDC), in the pavilion at Pemaquid Beach, offering a welcoming experience for visitors from near and far who come to enjoy the beautiful clean beach, salt marsh, and park grounds. BDC provides information about the beach environment and how to protect it for future generations. This past summer the display area was open for self-guided exploration, and staffed by a Coastal Rivers intern five days a week. A popular weekly touch tank gives visitors hands-on opportunities to learn about a variety of marine animals and plants. In 2023, the Discovery Center logged 1,500 visitors.

Formerly Damariscotta River Association and Pemaquid Watershed Association, Coastal Rivers Conservation Trust is a nationally accredited land trust. Our accreditation was renewed in 2020 after rigorous peer review. This distinction signifies we meet the highest standards of financial management, ethical conduct, responsible government, and lasting stewardship.

Thank you for supporting ElderCare Network and many other organizations that strengthen our communities each year.

In the past 25 years, we have cared for more than 750 Lincoln County residents in our seven homes. ECN homes are the only facilities in Lincoln County for people who are no longer able to live independently and who cannot afford local private-pay facilities (which can cost between \$100,000 and \$150,000 per year or more). Generally, about 90% of our residents are MaineCare participants. All these people have worked their whole lives, but simply run out of funds as they get older, and they now need support from the MaineCare system to help pay for their assisted living homes.

However, after our MaineCare residents pay all but \$70 of their monthly income for their assisted living, MaineCare only covers about 85% of the total costs of care, food, and housing. In addition, there is no funding to maintain and improve the homes or for the wellness programs that keep people healthy. We rely on the generosity of our communities to fill the gap between actual costs and MaineCare funding each year. This support from our communities is critical to our ability to provide a quality program of care in homes that are a source of pride in the community.

We appreciate the Town of Bristol's support over the years that has helped to keep our doors open.

The Fishermen's Museum, John Allan, Treasurer

The Museum celebrated our 51st season at the Pemaquid Point Lighthouse Park this past year and recorded attendance for the 2023 season was 30,134 visitors.

Admission is free and the Museum is open during normal Lighthouse Park hours.

Our collection of local fishing heritage includes original tools, traps, nets and artifacts, displays, dioramas, ships logs and first-person accounts of shipwrecks, along with rare and unusual items that present the history of the Bristol community to visitors from home and away.

The donations the Museum receives support artifact restoration, exhibit maintenance and our small operating budget, with the balance donated to the Town of Bristol. Our 2023 contribution of \$3,055.57 raises the total amount donated to the Town to \$281,177.00 since 1972.

Our annual Scholarship has been awarded since the 1980s and is open to Bristol students pursuing careers in marine related activities such as boat building, fishing, marine ecology and biological studies, engineering, history, or other maritime fields. Information about our scholarship and applications can be obtained at the Lincoln Academy guidance office or downloaded from our website.

We hope our website www.thefishermensmuseum.org has helped convince some travelers to stop and visit Pemaquid Point. On our site, you can take photo tours through our galleries and read about the complete history of the Lighthouse. Many archival documents and photographs are posted including the wreck of the Angel Gabriel, a listing of all of Maine's Lighthouses, How to Catch a Lobster and much more.

As we end our 51st year, the Museum Board of Directors would like again to acknowledge the foresight and tireless support of the original founders of the Museum, the numerous residents who donated many of the artifacts on display and the hundreds of volunteers who have contributed so much over the past 51 years. The Fishermen's Museum is, and will always remain, a community effort.

As always, the Board of Directors wishes to express their appreciation to the Bristol Park's Commission and Park Staff for their support and assistance during the past year.



Healthy Kids, Charlene Corbett, Executive Director

Thank you so much for your support of Healthy Kids. Healthy Kids has been the Child Abuse Prevention Council of Lincoln County since 1985. Our mission is to encourage, support and promote the healthy development of all our children so that they may grow into healthy, contributing members of our community. In July 2023, Healthy Kids' Board of Directors voted unanimously to expand our service area to include Knox County. To do this important work, we hired a second Community Educator, Toby LeCrone. In August, we welcomed our new Lincoln Community Educator, Sofie Watts. During this transition, we have continued our longstanding commitment to Lincoln County by continuing our services and programs without interruption, including starting up a weekly in-person parent-child play group for children ages 0-5, which has been quite successful after several years of Covid distancing.

In 2023, Healthy Kids provided services directly to 286 Bristol residents. Additionally, 10 parents from Bristol actively engaged in our resource center and/or referral system. Many Bristol residents continue to utilize the 6,017 service units of our social media activities (Facebook, Facebook Live and Instagram) for families with younger children, our website, parenting resources, and our LCTV series on parenting. Participants of our programs include parents, teachers, students, children, day care providers, physicians, law enforcement, school board members, town council members and general assistance staff, service club members, inmates, and other community representatives including Bristol residents who may work with children elsewhere in the county and still receive professional training. The services included:

- Monthly parenting tips produced by Healthy Kids and distributed through the schools and day cares for families with children ages 0-14

- Mandated Reporting, Safe Sleep, Period of Purple Crying and Strengthening Families programs for professionals who work with children

- · Periodic Facebook Live activities for families with young children
- LCTV TV series on parenting topics
- Educational classes for high school health classes, teaching about Shaken Baby Syndrome (preventing head trauma), the impact of drugs and alcohol on babies and basic infant care

In 2023-24, we also started a new emergency car seat program by referral from local first responders and the hospital. We are thankful for your support and will continue to provide services to the professionals and families in Bristol.

Since 1998, we have transported more than 37,000 patients, including residents of every single Maine city, town, plantation, and community. Since 1998, we have transported 46 residents of Bristol, with 5 in the last year. Additionally, we have landed in Bristol for 1 scene call since 1998.

Each year, we reach out to all municipalities in the state to invite them to support our Community Giving Campaign to ensure that LifeFlight teams can continue to answer the call for help today and for years to come. Since 2006, 266 communities have contributed a total of \$840,000. New Hope Midcoast, Joan LeMole

New Hope Midcoast, the Regional Domestic Violence Resource Center serving Sagadahoc, Lincoln, Knox, and Waldo Counties, believes that a life free from abuse is a fundamental human right and works to build a culture that will not tolerate domestic abuse. We support people as they create pathways to safety and support a more just and effective response to domestic violence and abuse through community education and empowerment. Our comprehensive services include a 24/7 helpline for victims and concerned others, advocacy (including legal advocacy and court accompaniment), support groups, housing with case management, and trainings for schools, civic organizations, professional healthcare providers, and businesses.

During fiscal year 2023 (October 1, 2022 – September 30, 2023), our trained advocates served 19 Bristol residents requiring a total of 49.4 hours of staff time. We also provided 717 bed nights for residents of Lincoln County who left their abusers and offered community education and prevention services for 1,656 Lincoln County residents. This required 275.63 staff hours.

Our agency believes that the misuse of power to demean or control others fosters oppression and violence. This manifests itself as racism, sexism, classism, homophobia, religious bigotry, domestic abuse, and other forms of violence. New Hope Midcoast believes that a just and peaceful society must commit itself to confronting and overcoming all forms of oppression and violence. We sincerely appreciate the opportunity to provide services for Bristol residents.

Old Bristol Historical Society, Mark Ziarnik, President

Founded in 2003, the Old Bristol Historical Society (OBHS), located in Bristol, Maine, is a charitable and educational nonprofit corporation serving the public. Headquartered at the Bristol History Center located at 2089 Bristol Road, our mission is to collect, preserve, and share the Bristol region's rich history and prehistory for present and future generations.

A big highlight from 2023 was the ribbon cutting on our new climate-controlled, fire-proof, walk-in archival vault. Our heartfelt thank you to all the donors and volunteers who made this vault possible. And we are deeply grateful to the Town of Bristol for generously contributing 28% of the construction cost of the vault, which turns out to correspond almost exactly with the amount of vault shelf space that will be required to store archived town records that will be moving from the attic of the town hall in 2024. We are excited to be putting the vault to work!

Other highlights from 2023 include a new exhibit in the upper gallery of our history center focused on Bristol stores of the past. The exhibit, titled "Supplies, Sundries & Sustenance: The Stores of Bristol, 1855-1970". We also hosted our popular summer lecture series, participated in the annual Bristol Days events, and published our spring and fall newsletters (available on our website).

Our publicly searchable online archives and physical library continues to grow. Our website has links to our collections and resources. As of the end of 2023, we had a total of 5,829 catalog items including objects, photos, archives, and books. By that time there were 2,885 people/genealogical records and 3,379 search terms. Check them out!

Thanks to our many volunteers and supporters, we are also building for the future. Early in 2023 we teamed with the Bristol Lions to form the Bristol Lions Legacy Fund, administered by OBHS, to award educational grants to graduating local high school seniors. OBHS also formed the 1765 Fund, an endowment which we aspire to grow to help assure our long-term sustainability. The remaining large concrete foundation was removed from the northwest corner of the property, clearing the way for landscaping an inviting and educational park space. Finally, by the end of the year sufficient progress had been made restoring the mill building that prospects look good for opening the main floor and undercroft as a museum in the coming year.

The Pemaquid Group of Artists (PGA) celebrated our 95th year during the 2023 season - the last 62 years on the grounds of Lighthouse Park. One of the oldest artist organizations in Maine, PGA members are artists who reside in Lincoln County. The Pemaquid Art Gallery welcomes park visitors from all over the world.

The summer of 2023 was for the most part back to normal. We began to have the usual stream of visitors and sales were steady. The Gallery opened Memorial Day Weekend and we held the Grand Opening Reception inside for the first time in a few years. We held an outdoor tent sale on July 17th, a Patron Appreciation reception on August 4th and a plein air day of painting on Lighthouse Open House Day on September 10th. Overall, our 2023 season was a success. We sincerely thank Shelly Gallagher, the Bristol Parks Commission and all the staff at Lighthouse Park for their help and support.

Again, this year we continued to support art education with financial donations to Bristol Consolidated School, South Bristol Elementary School, Great Salt Bay School and Lincoln Academy art departments and Healthy Kids and Coastal Kids programs. In addition, we continue to fund a Portland Museum of Art pass through Skidompha Library in Damariscotta.

Patrons are an important source of support for the gallery, and we were able to hold our usual Patron Reception and raffle in August. Since its founding in 1972, the Central Maine Area Agency on Aging, doing business as Spectrum Generations, has persistently strived to promote and advance the well-being and independence of older and disabled adults, with the support of their caregivers, to live in the community of their choice. Our service areas have steadily grown, expanding our coverage within the six central Maine counties, as well as the towns of Brunswick and Harpswell.

Over the past 50 years, the organization has implemented complex, multisector projects involving multiple organizations and/or funding sources to include Mainecare, Medicare, federal Older American Act funding, state grants, Veteran's Affairs, commercial insurers, and private foundations and donations. Through this braided funding, Spectrum Generations is a leading provider of nutrition services (both home-delivered and congregate), information and advice, referrals, caregiving support, licensed (Adult Day and Community Case Management) and registered (Personnel Support Services) Home and Community Based (HCBS) programs, as well as health promotion, wellness, and social activities for older and disabled adults

Over the past year, Spectrum Generations has provided services to the Town of Bristol in the following ways:

- Through our Meals on Wheels program, we have delivered 1,439 meals to nine homebound older adults.
- We provided services to 65 unduplicated residents of Bristol.
- Our Aging and Disability Resource Specialist made 113 contacts of outreach and counseling on topics such as elder abuse, prescription drug coverage, and long-term care, benefiting 56 people.
- Additionally, eight caregivers received respite services, helping them balance work, and caring for an older or disabled loved one.

Over the last few years, Spectrum Generations has initiated the following programs: Rural Community Improvement Partnership (R-CHIP), Respite for ME, and the provision of Medical Nutrition Therapy and Nutrition Counseling for Meals on Wheels recipients by a registered dietician. R-CHIP focuses on researching community health needs and resources in Kennebec and Somerset Counties. Respite for Me assists caregivers by reimbursing them for the cost of an overnight stay, the expenses incurred when the care recipient attends Adult Day services, and reimbursement for maintaining a safe environment within the recipient's home.

With constant changes in our environment, Spectrum Generations remains steadfast in providing vital services to older and disabled Mainers. In the communities we support, we maintain enthusiasm about bringing essential programs and services to those in need.

We thank our valued staff, resolute volunteers, community partners, and you for allowing us to grow! We could not provide our services without their and your support.
