## **Disaster Recovery Centers in Maine Change Hours of Operation**

**SOUTH PORTLAND, Maine** – Starting on Monday, April 22, all FEMA Disaster Recovery Centers in Maine will be open Monday-Saturday 9:00 a.m.–5:00 p.m. The centers will be closed on Sundays.

Survivors in Cumberland, Hancock, Knox, Lincoln, Sagadahoc, Waldo, Washington and York counties who were impacted by the January 9-13 severe storms and flooding can visit any of the four DRCs in Maine:

- York County: Wells Fire Station, 585 N Berwick Rd, Wells, ME 04090
- Hancock County: Moore Community Center, 125 State St, Ellsworth, ME 04605
- Cumberland County: Old Orr's Island Schoolhouse, 1594 Harpswell Islands Road, Orr's Island, ME 04066
- Washington County: University of Maine, Torrey Building, 40 University Drive, Machias, ME 04654

DRCs provide information from Maine state agencies, FEMA and the U.S. Small Business Administration. Survivors can get help applying for federal assistance, update applications and learn about available resources.

All centers are accessible to people with disabilities and access and functional needs and are equipped with assistive technology equipment. If you need a reasonable accommodation or sign language interpreter, please let a FEMA specialist at the DRC know.
